

# S. P. CUTS FARES FOR TWO FRIDAYS

Special round trip fares of \$4.30 to Portland and return and \$11.90 to San Francisco and return are to be offered by the Southern Pacific company for two Fridays, February 20 and 27, according to an announcement made this morning by J. E. Clark, local agent. Providing for travel on all trains, both coach and Pullman, the special tickets will be good for four days from the date of issue. The return limit will be midnight of the Tuesday following the Friday upon which the tickets are sold.
