

Carnera, Handicapped by Cracked Rib, to Exchange Wallops Tonight with Maloney, Former Conqueror, Outweighed 65 Pounds

MIAMI, Fla., March 5.—To the somewhat fantastic history of this famous walloping playground the boys were prepared to add the 10-round battle of the cracked rib tonight, featuring the ponderous puncher from Italy, Primo Carnera, and the Irishman from Boston, Jimmy Maloney.

Miami and its ocean front neighbor, Miami Beach, have known the peak of boxing's boom days. Two years ago the Stribling-Sharkey bout drew over \$400,000. The downward slide since then has been marked by the Sharkey-Scott fiasco, a losing venture of 1929, and the financial distress attending the Walker-Risiko show a week ago in the Madison Square Garden stadium.

Fans Apathetic
Carnera's return joust with Maloney has failed to stimulate either the local flistic pulse or the cash customers from elsewhere. Promoter Frank J. Bruen continued optimistic today in the hope he might at least break even. An unreasonable drop in temperature has chilled the prospects for tonight.

Primo will have upwards of a 65-pound pull in the weights, a doctor in his corner to treat his damaged rib and instructions to try for an early knockout.

The preliminary card is headed by an eight-round match between Maxie Rosenbloom of New York, lightweight champion, and Marty Gallagher of Washington, D. C. Rosenbloom's title is not at stake.

Promoter Bruen forbade broadcasting and fixed the main go for about 10 p. m. (eastern time).

THOMPSON VICTOR BUT UNIMPRESSIVE

SAN FRANCISCO, March 5.—Young Jack Thompson, former welterweight champion of the world, successfully negotiated the first step of his comeback last night by knocking out Babe Anderson, of San Jose, in the ninth round of a ten-round bout.

Fans agreed, however, the negro ex-champion was unimpressive in his victory. He carried the poundage of a middleweight, 151 pounds, and appeared sluggish.

Thompson is already signed for a bout in Cleveland April 17 with the present welter king, Tommy Freeman.

DON GEORGE PINNS EVERETT MARSHALL

The suit was filed against the Cardinals and Christ O'Brien, former owner of the club. Lamb charges the money is due on his 1929 card contract.

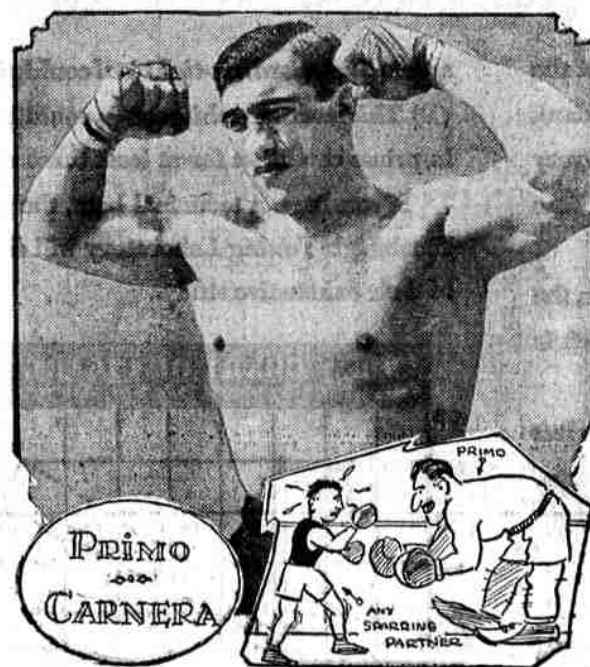
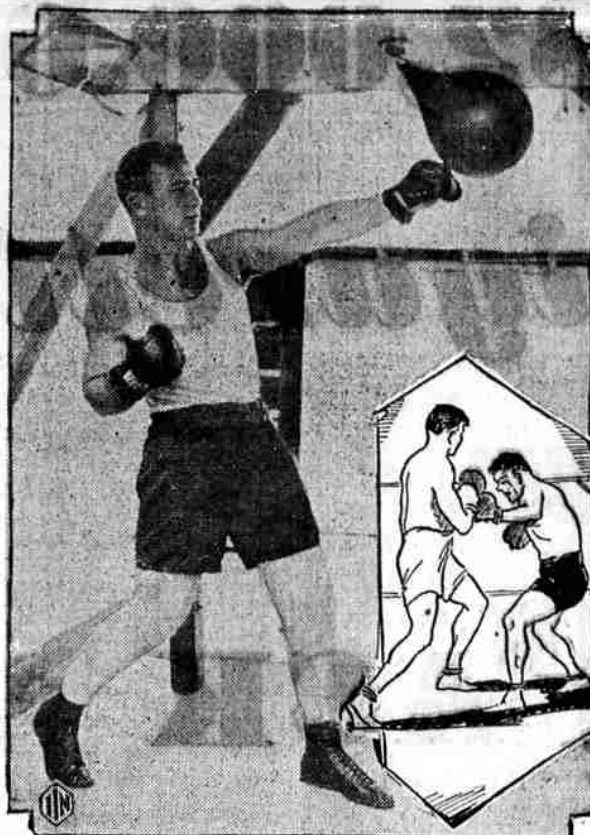
HINDU-MOSLEM GRID GAME STARTS RIOT

POLITICAL UPSET OCCURS IN VERMONT

G. O. P. Names W. Austin for Senator in Face of Proctor Rivalry.

MONTPELIER, Vt., March 4.—Conservative Vermont broke today from a minor revolution in politics. She was still republican, but she had turned against her best known leaders by nominating Warren R. Austin, 54, for the United States senate.

Austin has still to defeat Stephen Driscoll of St. Albans, the dem-

ocratic nominee, later this month, but he was as good as elected yesterday when he won the republican primary race from Senator Frank C. Partridge by 43,331 votes to 35,434.

Partridge was appointed to fill the seat left vacant by the death of Senator Frank L. Greene. He had the backing of Redfield Proctor, leading contemporary representative of a family which has given Vermont senators and governors for half a century.

Prohibition did not figure in the primary. In the election, Austin, a dry, will oppose a wet in Driscoll.
