

FORMER LA GRANDE OFFICIAL ON TRIAL

Mrs. Fowler's Attorney
Denies She's Short in
Treasury Account.

LA GRANDE, Ore., March 17.—Denial that Mrs. Emma Fowler, 59, city treasurer of La Grande for ten years, is guilty or responsible in any way for a shortage of approximately \$112,000 in her accounts, was made by her attorneys in opening arguments of her trial here for larceny of public funds. Testimony in the case started today.

Mrs. Fowler never misappropriated a penny of La Grande city funds while serving as its treasurer, Henry Neas, defense attorney, declared. "The evidence in this case will prove it beyond the shadow of a doubt."

He said the treasurer's books at La Grande have "not always balanced" for several years. He said the system used is bad.

"Mrs. Fowler is not an auditor—only a bookkeeper," the attorney continued. "She, herself, discovered there was a bookkeeping shortage when the time came to make the turnover to the new treasurer last month. She made no secret of it. She could not figure out what was wrong, but she had not appropriated a penny to her own use and had nothing to conceal."

While city officials contend approximately \$112,000 of city funds is missing, no one, so far as is known, has been able to account for their disappearance.

SIX CARS TOPPLED BUT NO LIVES LOST

BRISTOL, Pa., March 17.—Railroad men and Bristol police today viewed the derailment of a Pennsylvania passenger train here last night with no loss of life and serious injury to only one person as remarkable.

Six cars of a train bound from Philadelphia for New York, left the yards. Three day coaches and a baggage car toppled down a steep embankment, coming to rest on the edge of Grady lake, which is 20 feet deep. Less than ten feet of muddy, slippery earth separated the coaches from the lake. All cars were steered.

When firemen and police had extricated the passengers from the overturned cars all but six or eight were found to have escaped unhurt. Those injured, with the exception of James W. Wahl, 60, of Philadelphia, suffered only slight cuts and bruises. Wahl was injured about the back.

CHINA EXECUTES 73 RED OFFICERS

CANTON, China, March 17.—Seventy-three officers of the Chinese army were executed here today after discovery of a communist plot to start mutiny in the troops at Swatow. A hundred other officers and soldiers are awaiting sentence.

The central government stated in connection with the executions that it was having considerable trouble with red activity and influences, which have obtained a strong hold throughout the country.

Ten days ago a division of government troops stationed on the Peking-Hankow railroad maintained because they believed that their disbandment was imminent, and tore the tracks up in their neighborhood. They joined red forces in ravaging the surrounding country.

BOLT-NUT-RIVET TRUST DISSOLVED

Violation of Law Seen by
U. S. Judge; Legal Firm
to Be Organized.

NEW YORK, March 17.—Federal Judge Frank J. Coleman today ordered the dissolution of the Bolt, Nut and Rivet Manufacturers' association, controlling about 95 per cent of the industry, holding that it was in restraint of trade and a violation of the Sherman anti-trust laws.

Counsel for the association, doing an annual business of approximately \$75,000,000, agreed to the

issuance of the order. The decree forbids all preferential lists of customers and requires each member of the association to fix its own prices.

The Bethlehem Steel corporation, Republic Steel, and Pittsburgh Screw and Bolt company, are among the fifty members of the association which has its headquarters in Pittsburgh. They were named as defendants by the government.

Charles J. Graham, president of the trade association, announced while the association was ordered to dissolve as a price fixing body in restraint of trade, the members proposed to form a new trade association which would conform to federal laws. He said the government had granted permission for the organization of such an association.

The association was formed in 1925 when the industry was losing approximately \$3,000,000 a year, according to the officers, and

Murphy pleaded guilty to both charges. He received a \$100 fine for possession and a 60-day jail term and \$250 fine for sale.

STOCK SALE PERMITS DENIED TO 3 FIRMS

SALEM, March 17.—The Patterson Aircraft corporation of Salem and the Klawanda Products company of Portland were both denied permission to sell \$50,000 common stock each in the state of Oregon, it was announced today by Mark McAllister, corporation commissioner.

A third firm, the Yellow Hawk Natural Gas company of Milton, a Washington corporation, was also denied a permit to sell \$125,000 of common stock by the commission.
