What Price Feed?

Cottage Grove, Ore., March 10, 1931.

CROWN MILLS, Portland, Oregon. Dear Sirs:

In checking over the grade sheets for January when I marketed 497 turkeys, I find that in the entire pool 46% of the toms graded prime while in my flock 62% of them graded prime. This percentage of primes is not nearly as high as it is possible to secure. The average dressed weights for toms and hens in this section was 12.83 lbs. My flock averaged 16.07 lbs. throughout the market season. Now having 16% more prime toms than the average and by having the birds 3.15 lbs. heavier made a gross income of \$1.21 more than the average per bird. This \$1.21 over the average was obtained at the feed cost of producing 3.15 lbs. of turkey meat or approximately \$.42. Thus by spending .42c more for feed I received \$1.21 more per turkey, and when you multiply this by the number I raised, you get figures that look interesting.

In arriving at the feed cost per pound, I charged my birds with the retail price in Cottage Grove of 2,700 lbs. of Crown Kompresst Complete Turkey Feed, 5,900 lbs. Crown Kompresst Mash Turkey Feed, 17,400 lbs. Crown Kompresst Turkey Fattener Feed, 15,000 lbs. home grown wheat and corn. This makes a feed cost of about \$.13 per pound, and 1 pound of dressed turkey meat for each 5.4 lbs. of feed used. When we consider the fact that we continued a certain phase of the experimental feeding for some time after the results showed that that method was not economical the results here given, which include all the feed and all the turkeys in the experiment, are even more outstanding.

At different times during the market season I delivered birds at Oakland, Yoncalla and Cottage Grove. The splendid condition of my turkeys was a source of wonder and favorable comment by all who saw them.

In past years I have tried nearly every kind of feed for starting poults from bread crumbs, cottage cheese and boiled eggs to many combinations of grain and by-products. In all of my experience, I have never used a feed that was so easily fed and gave such uniformly good results as Crown Feeds.
