

LUMBERMEN RAP U. S.-CANADA PACT

SEATTLE, Dec. 16.—(AP)—The West Coast Lumbermen's association decided the lumber provisions of the newly-signed United States, Canada reciprocal trade treaty today.

The association, through Col. W. R. Greeley, its secretary-manager, announced it had adopted a three-point resolution setting forth the conclusions of representatives of the Pacific northwest lumber industry.

The resolution put an association demand for "relief" from the treaty squarely up to President Roosevelt. It was adopted by the association trustees after a survey and study of the legal grounds upon which the validity of the treaty or its lumber provisions might be attacked, Col. Greeley said.

The three points set forth in the resolution were:

The association views the lumber provisions of the treaty as a "very serious mistake by the government, causing great injury to the Pacific northwest lumber industry and its employees."

The industry looks to the government for "measures of relief from the onerous effects of the agreement, both in the administration of the tariff and hemlock quota of imports from Canada and also in future reciprocity trade agreement negotiations."

The association has no further present intention of contesting the validity of the treaty but is confident the administration "will do its utmost to relieve and improve the condition of the industry."

The association, Greeley explained, has strongly opposed any let-down in duties on Douglas fir, west coast hemlock, western spruce manufactured in British Columbia.

"We are convinced the cut of one-half in the American duty on these woods, now written into the agreement with a quota of 250 million feet on fir and hemlock imports annually, resulted from a serious failure on the part of the government to understand the depressed conditions in the industry, its importance to employment and its wage and hour scales in comparison with the competitive industry of Canada," Greeley said.

"It is important that the fir and hemlock quota be not dumped upon the American market in short periods of the year, but distributed through the year under a reasonable monthly limitation."
