HOP GROWERS SIGN FOR CONTROL PLAN

SALEM, Dec. 19 — (AP)—Four hundred Oregon hop growers, meeting here yesterday, progressed toward a cooperative plan to take care of 80,000 bales of surplus hops, to control future production and to stop planting of additional hop acreage.

Growers representing 49,000 bales of the annual Oregon production of 165,000 bales, had signed late yesterday for a statewide hop growers' cooperative to handle the hop control problem.

Lean Walker, chairman of the committee which worked out the mutual plan, said next Tuesday night would be set as the deadline before which 55 per cent of the annual tonnage in the state could be signed for the program.

"If we cannot get 55 per cent of the total yield signed we shall not go ahead. Any plan to be effective requires that much support," Walker said.

The tentative program outlined by Walker and the committee included the following points:

Organization of growers in Oregon, Washington and California into three cooperative associations, with a joint control board to be known as National Hop Growers, Inc.

The organization to be empowered to levy a one and a half per cent tax on the 1936 crop and succeeding years, to buy, hold or destroy the existing surplus.

The organization would set a production quota for each grower. Sale of hops by members would be strictly prohibited.

Brewers would be asked for a pledge not to purchase hops raised outside the cooperative.

A research department would be set up to study improvements in hop production methods.

Existing contracts would not be interfered with although they would be considered in allocating permitted yields.
