COACHELLA TUNNEL IS HOLED THROUGH

INMO, Calif., Jan. 2.—(AP)—The longest tunnel of its circumference in the world was holed through at 12:25 o'clock today.

Jesse H. Jones, chairman of the reconstruction finance corporation, was among the officials who witnessed the blast carrying away the last barriers in the center of the 18-mile east Coachella tunnel of the Metropolitan water district of southern California.

The tunnel, 150 miles east of Los Angeles, is one of the units in the \$225,000,000 aqueduct project to bring Colorado river water to 13 southern California cities.

The tunnel is horseshoe-shaped, 18 feet in diameter, and cuts through one of the desert mountain ranges 15 miles north of here.

ELECTRICITY FOR FARMS PROPOSED

Nine-Year Program to Aid Rural Areas Asked in Bill by Norris.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 2.—(AP)—A bill to authorize a \$900,000,000 self-liquidating rural electrification program in the next nine years was projected today by Senator Norris (R., Neb.).

The senator outlined plans for the bill he expects to introduce early in the session after a conference today with Morris L. Cooke, rural electrification administrator.

It would authorize congress to appropriate \$100,000,000 a year for loans for three purposes: (1) For rural transmission lines, (2) For electric appliances, and (3) for electrification of farm homes. The loans would be limited to public agencies and cooperatives with a specific ban against lending funds to private power companies.

Norris said the bill would make the present REA a permanent independent organization with an administrator appointed by the president for a nine year term. It would limit the interest rates on the loans to 3 per cent and require amortization of all loans within a 40 year period.

Of the \$100,000,000 which could be appropriated annually, \$70,000,000 would be divided among the states in proportion to their rural population not now supplied with central power service. The administrator could use his judgment in apportionment of the remainder except that not more than \$10,000,000 could be used in any one state.

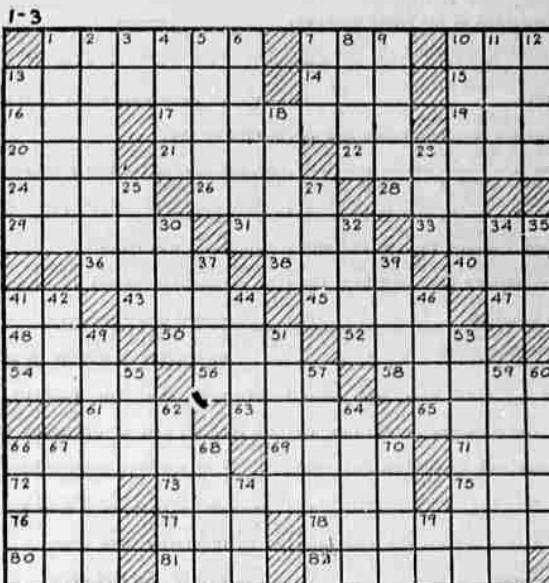
