Plans for the immediate purchase of 3,000 new refrigerator cars at a cost of more than \$10,000,000 for the Pacific Fruit Express company, jointly owned by the Southern Pacific and Union Pacific, were announced by A. D. McDonald, president of the Southern Pacific company.

Representing the latest scientific achievements of designers and builders, the new cars will embody important improvements in refrigerator car construction. It was stated.

This, McDonald noted, is of first importance to far western growers and shippers, who are more dependent upon efficient railroad service to distant markets than those of any other region.

Gidding, vice president and general manager of the Pacific Fruit Express, points out that his company operates the world's largest refrigerator car service. Starting with an initial supply of 6000 refrigerator cars in 1907, the Pacific Fruit Express now has about 35,000 cars.
