

SENATOR HASTINGS DEFENDS DU PONT

WASHINGTON, Jan. 30.—(AP)—Rising to defend Pierre S. Du Pont, Senator Hastings (R., Del.), said today that the manufacturer paid \$4,562,988 income tax for 1929 and contributed \$882,473 to charity that year.

Hastings, speaking on the senate floor, assailed as an "infamous slander" the recent attack which Senator Schwelienbach (D., Wash.), made upon Du Pont.

The Delaware senator said such a "vicious attack" upon "one of the most distinguished citizens of my state" was a "blot" upon Schwelienbach's record.

Schwelienbach, in the course of a speech denouncing the American Liberty league as controlled by "radicals and crooks," referred to income tax litigations the government has aimed at Du Pont. The government contends a securities transaction between Du Pont and John J. Raskob, another Liberty league backer, was not in good faith.

Hastings, implying that Du Pont was a victim of government "terrorism" because he backed the Liberty league in its onslaught on the new deal, said:

"This man, who paid more than 4 1/2 millions of dollars as an income tax for 1929; this man, who contributed to charity for that same year slightly less than a million

SUICIDE VICTIM IS FOUND NEAR BAKER

BAKER, Jan. 30.—(AP)—The body of a young man who apparently killed himself with a small calibre rifle some time last week was found by state highway workers near the Baker-Homestead highway two miles east of Baker today.

The body is frozen so solidly officers will be unable to determine the exact location of the bullet wound until probably Friday. The barrel of the gun, lying beneath the body, was grasped in the left hand.

Officers estimated the man's age at from 30 to 35 years. He was between 5 feet 10 inches and six feet tall and weighed about 160 pounds. He had brown hair, wore a new light colored felt hat, black oxford, brown trousers, black all-over sweater, light brown overcoat and black bow tie. Upon the body were found cigarettes, rifle cartridges, \$2.66 and road maps and matches picked up in California and southern Oregon.

EX-CON CITIZEN 35 YEARS AFTER TERM

SALEM, Jan. 30.—(AP)—Thirty-five years after he had served a term in the state penitentiary on a manslaughter charge James Colwell today requested and was granted a full pardon which again gives him the rights of citizenship.

Governor Martin issued the pardon following presentations Colwell had conducted himself since as a law-abiding resident. He now resides in Cedarville, Calif.

Colwell was first sentenced from Malheur county to life imprisonment in 1902. He was granted a new trial and the conviction was changed from second degree murder to manslaughter for which he was sentenced September 26, 1904 to six years. He served his time and was paroled on good behavior in June, 1907.

The governor also revoked the conditional pardon granted William Lawler, of Multnomah county. Lawler had been sentenced to 12 years for assault and robbery June 1, 1922. He was granted a conditional pardon March 5, 1925.

Since that time Lawler has been in the toils of law 10 different times in Washington, Oregon and California. His latest offense was the past week in Lincoln county which resulted in his pardon being revoked.

TAX PLAN FOR NEW FARM BILL EYED

WASHINGTON, Jan. 30.—(AP)—A tax bill to finance the new farm program was projected by the administration today coincident with the formal report to the senate of the soil conservation subsidy plan.

Attorney General Cummings said the tax program would go to Capitol Hill within a week. Simultaneously, President Roosevelt summoned to the white house Secretaries Morgenthau and Wallace, Cummings and Daniel W. Bell, director of the budget, to discuss the problem of financing subsidy payments.

The annual cost of the temporary farm bill which the agriculture committee formally laid before the senate today has been estimated at \$440,000,000. Whether the tax program under consideration would seek to raise all this amount, more or less, was not known.

Wallace has made known that means of regaining the \$200,000,000 return to processors by the supreme court's AAA decision comprise at least one phase of the tax plans under consideration.

Senator Bankhead, who reported the farm bill to the senate, said he would call it up for consideration Monday.
