PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 7.—(AP)—Light sales continued at unchanged prices in the Pacific coast hop market the week ending February 5, the bureau of agricultural economics reported today. Oregon growers sold 858 bales and California growers 400 bales, the trade reported. Oregon growers netted nine cents a pound on 412 bales of good prime quality new crop clusters; 8 1/2 cents a pound on 55 bales; 7c on 226 bales, and 6 1/2c on 125 bales of off grade hops. No interest was shown in old crop holdings. The California sales were confined to the Sacramento valley, and
