

MRS. R. QUINE OUT FOR SCHOOL POST

Announcement was made today by Mrs. Ralph Quine (Stella Wicklem) that she will be a candidate at the primary election May 15 for the nomination for county superintendent of schools.

Mrs. Quine has had six years of experience in teaching, in addition to other active work in school administration and educational affairs.

She is a graduate of La Crosse, Wis., normal school and had four years of teaching experience in Eau Claire, Wisconsin, before coming to Roseburg.

She taught two years in the Rose school at Roseburg prior to her marriage to the late Sergeant Ralph Quine of the Oregon State Police.

Since her marriage, she has continued work in the local schools as a substitute teacher, and has also been very active in Parent-Teacher association activities.

Following the death of her husband, she was made county supervisor of adult education, and is now in charge of this program for Douglas county.

She is a member of the Presbyterian church and of the American Legion auxiliary.

She has two daughters attending school in Roseburg.

ROMANCE ENDED BY DOUBLE TRAGEDY

CHICAGO, Feb. 26.—(AP)—Prof. Mary H. Carter, red-haired, 30, and single, was found fatally wounded today beside the body of Basil E. Cole, young railroad executive, in the tragic ending of a clandestine romance.

The dying girl's hand clutched a revolver, said Police Sergeant Ralph McKenna.

He put forward the theory that Miss Carter, believed to be a former Decatur, Ill., nurse, killed Cole and then shot herself as they lay side by side in a hotel room shared since Sunday.

A note believed to be in the woman's handwriting made it appear, however, that the two died in a suicide pact because they rebelled at being forced into a "back street" affair.

The note was not signed. Cole was married and the father of two children. His wife, at their former home in Clinton, Mo., said she did not know he and Miss Carter had been having a romance.

MILICENT ROGERS WEDS NUMBER THREE

NEW YORK, Feb. 26.—(AP)—The New York Evening Journal said today Millicent Rogers Saltonstall, daughter of the late Henry Huddleston Rogers, was married to Ronald Balcom, young New York broker, in Vienna yesterday.

The Journal said the couple will spend the remainder of the winter season in the Tyrol, and then live in Paris or London.

This is the third marriage of the former Millicent Rogers, heiress to the Standard Oil fortune. Her first husband was Count Ludwig Saltonstall, a German nobleman, whom she married in 1924. The marriage ended in divorce in 1927.

After a brief romance, she then married Arturo Ramos of Argentina. They were divorced in Reno last year.

Mrs. Balcom has three sons—one Peter, now 11, by her first marriage, and two by her second.

MEDFORD LABORER COMMITS SUICIDE

MEDFORD, Ore., Feb. 26.—(AP)—Harold A. Duffy, 26, laborer, committed suicide this afternoon by hanging himself, after two previous attempts at suicide failed. Derangement over domestic affairs was given by the state police as the reason for the act.

Duffy, according to the state police, attempted to lie down in front of a moving auto, and pounded himself in the head with an axe, then he fled to an abandoned shed and found the rope with which he ended his life.

Duffy, according to an official statement, called upon his wife and a Miss Stella Stephenson, at the latter's home this morning, to discuss pending divorce proceedings. Duffy during the visit struck Miss Stephenson over the head with a pistol, and then fled, with the state police on his trail.

Duffy has been employed on local relief projects the past month.

DEATH INCENDIARIST GETS FIFTY YEARS

LAWRENCE, Kas., Feb. 26.—(AP)—Eldon King, 22, pleaded guilty in district court here today to a charge of second degree murder in connection with a fire at Baldwin in which two women perished, and was sentenced to serve a 50-year penitentiary term.

Before King's plea was entered his attorney, George Melvin, read the young man's confession to the court. In it King admitted setting the blaze in which his wife's mother and grandmother, Mrs. Wiley Hausam, 45, and Mrs. Sarah

Effort to prevent death drop fails.

NEW YORK, Feb. 26.—(AP)—After being held by a window cleaner and a woman stenographer until the woman's strength failed, Henry Gerdes, 68, a milk merchant, of Woodcliff, N. J., plunged to his death today from a window of his fifth floor office in the midtown district.

Screams from a show-room below the window attracted the attention of the stenographer, Caroline Weinberger, 22. Running to the window, she saw Gerdes hanging outside, holding to the sill.

A window-cleaner who was at work, supported by his safety-strap at the floor below, seized Gerdes' ankles, while Miss Weinberger, leaning from the floor above, grasped her employer's wrist.

For about a minute, a spectator said, she supported Gerdes' weight. Then he slipped, the window-cleaner was unable to check the fall, and Gerdes catapulted to the street.

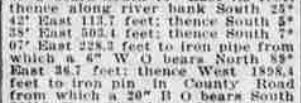
