

NORRIS DAM BUTTON PRESSED BY F. R.

WASHINGTON, March 4.—(AP)—President Roosevelt pressed an electric button today at the white house that set a siren blowing on top of the \$36,000,000 Norris dam in Tennessee.

The signal notified workmen at the dam to close the sluice gates and began impounding the waters of the Clinch river. The project is part of the Tennessee valley program.

"I hope as many people as can will go to see the Norris dam in eastern Tennessee," President Roosevelt said. "It exemplifies great engineering skill, high construction efficiency, and above all it is the key to the carefully worked out control of a great river and its watershed spread over part of seven states."

"The Norris dam is a practical symbol of better life and greater opportunity for millions of citizens of our country."

"The nation has come to realize that national resources must not be wasted and the Norris dam is evidence that our program for conservation of these resources is going forward."

BRECKENRIDGE IS FOE OF NEW DEAL

NEW YORK, March 4.—(AP)—Col. Henry Breckinridge, in entering his name in the Ohio and Maryland democratic preferential primaries in opposition to President Roosevelt, is acting independently of other anti-new deal party leaders and forces.

"I saw the World war and its aftermaths sweep away constitutional democracy from much of the world," he said, "and unmistakable evidences and trends in the current administration in Washington have given me strong fears for the safety of political liberties in the United States. And there can be no economic liberty without political liberty."

U. S. LOAN HEAVILY OVER-SUBSCRIBED

WASHINGTON, March 4.—(AP)—Secretary Morgenthau said today the treasury's \$1,250,000,000 March borrowing was over-subscribed from five to seven times. While final figures have not been compiled, he said, reports already received indicated the cash offering of bonds would run well over seven times the \$650,000,000 asked. Subscriptions for the notes, of which \$800,000,000 were offered, were well over five times that amount.

The bonds have a maturity of 12 to 15 years, and pay interest at the rate of 2 1/2 per cent. The notes have a maturity of 5 years, and pay 1 1/2 per cent.

Subscription books on the offering were opened Monday and closed the same day.

Books will close Thursday night on the offer to exchange either the bonds or notes for \$559,000,000 of 2 7/8 per cent notes maturing April 15.

Youth Confesses "Torch Murder"

PORTLAND, Ore., March 4.—(AP)—Surgeons operated unexpectedly today on 10-year-old Lou Ann Markle, who was rushed here from Anchorage, Alaska, for treatment of an infected leg.

The child, in an anemic condition, had received two blood transfusions preparatory to the operation.

Two surgeons, Drs. Richard B. Dillehut and Leo B. Lucas, in draining the infection, found a part of the thigh bone dead and decided to operate without further delay.

"The operation was quite successful," said Dr. Dillehut. "In five to six months the little girl will be walking."

He said the only effect of the operation will be a "slight limp" caused by the enforced removal of a part of the bone.

Another operation will have to be performed in two months upon a section of the shin bone, and several more blood transfusions probably will be necessary.

LONDON ENDORSED BY KANSAS G. O. P.

WICHITA, Kans., March 4.—(AP)—Governor Alf M. Landon was endorsed for the presidential nomination by the republican state convention today.

The state's 18 delegates to the national convention in Cleveland were instructed to "use their utmost efforts" to secure Landon's nomination and "to continue to vote for him until he is nominated or until he releases them."

Landon, who has made no formal announcement on the campaign launched in his behalf, did not attend today's meeting.

Four delegates at large chosen today were: Senator Arthur Capper, William Allen White, Emporia editor; and Henry J. Allen, former senator and governor, and Mrs. E. C. Little.
