U. S. BURT OUT FOR STATE TREASURER

PORTLAND, Ore., March 16.—(AP)—U. S. Burt of Corvallis, president of the Young Democratic clubs of Oregon, announced his candidacy today for the democratic nomination for state treasurer. He is 40 years old.

He is head of the department of visual instruction of the Oregon state system of higher education.

"I am in favor of sound, adequate old age pensions," he said. "I do not favor the present system in Oregon that requires virtually a pauper's statement before an indigent can qualify. I favor decentralization of child welfare work."
