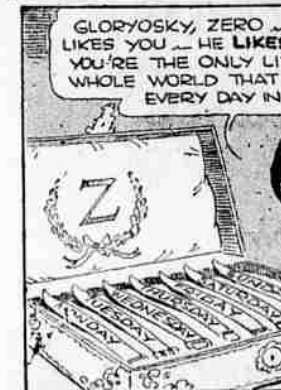

HARPER BATTLING EXTRADITION PLAN

Considerable delay has been experienced in securing the extradition of Frank Harper, recently arrested at Crescent City, Calif., upon a warrant from Douglas county, charging an attempt to secure property by false pretense. Harper is accused of attempting to buy an automobile here by use of a worthless check.

Harper, said to be an escapee from a life term as a habitual criminal in the Kansas penitentiary, is fighting extradition, and has demanded a hearing. The hearing, it is reported, is to be held Tuesday at Sacramento.

Deputy Sheriff Clifford Thornton went to Crescent City 10 days ago to get the prisoner and is still in Sacramento, pending the outcome of the hearing.

Lucy Rose, who is alleged to have posed as Harper's wife, is being held in the Douglas county jail.
