OREGON EVENTS FLASHED FROM WIRE SERVICE

LA GRANDE, Ore., April 2 — (AP) — Bishop William P. Remington of the eastern Oregon Episcopal district will remain in this area at least for another year, he told a church audience at Cove. The bishop recently was offered a position with a divinity school in Philadelphia.

BAKER, April 2 — Party registrations in Isaker county thus far show an increase of 211, of which 125 signed as democrats and 114 as republicans, county officials said. Total registration includes 1,698 democrats and 3,925 republicans.

PORTLAND, April 2 — Matilda M. Gearin, widow of the late senator John Gearin, left an estate valued at \$846,766, an appraisal filed in probate court showed.

PORTLAND, April 2 — Last-minute applications for credit under the home modernization program of the federal housing administration probably will boost total loans to more than \$4,200,000, Jameson Parker, state F. H. A. director, said today. Loans under the modernization provisions ended Tuesday night.

PORTLAND, April 2 — Five thousand Boy Scouts from ten Oregon and five Washington counties will assemble here tomorrow and Saturday at the Pacific International Livestock Exposition.

The Scouts will participate in a circus designed to stimulate interest in work being done by the boys.
