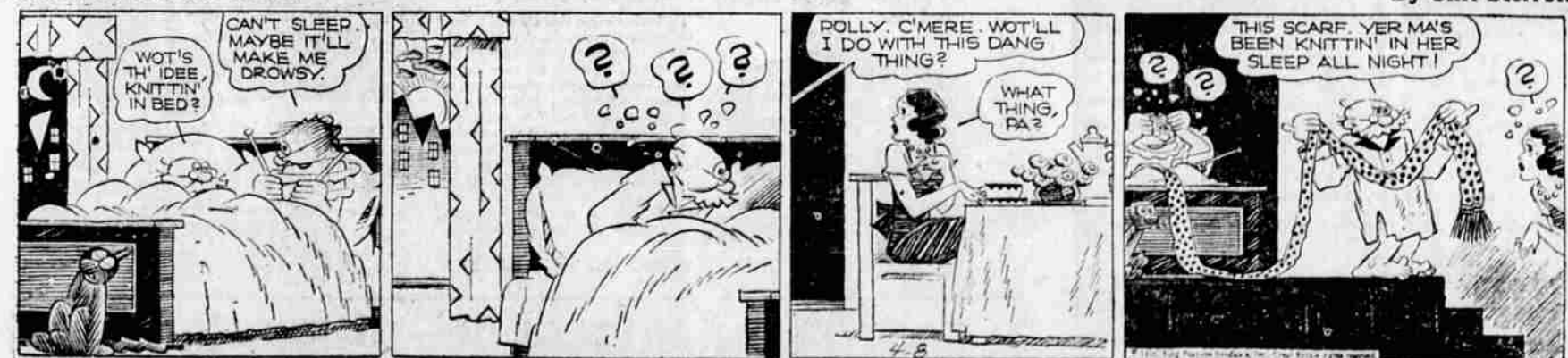

COVERED WAGON SYMBOL SPURNED

PORT ORFORD, Ore., April 7.—(AP)—The covered wagon may be a symbol of the pioneer in many places but old timers scoffed at it here.

In union they protested when the state, after dedicating a park here to the Oregon pioneers, started to add a covered wagon to the scene.

"We want no covered wagon; it is out of place here," said Frank Tichenor, explaining that the pioneers who established Port Orford in 1851 after repulsing an attack of several hundred Indians, came here by boat.

Tichenor remarked that if they had waited to drive in with ox teams they probably would not have arrived in time to be pioneers. He said that 30 years after Port Orford was founded there was not 100 yards of wagon road. There never has been a rail road.
