ADULT EDUCATION PROVES POPULAR

Can adults learn? Do adults wish to continue studies of interest to them?

According to the number of adults registered in these classes it is evident, according to Mrs. Ralph Quine, that they do. The number who registered in a three months' period totaled 1035, with fourteen teachers conducting the classes.

Subjects which have been taught are: Piano, wood carving, psychology, dramatics, crafts, shorthand, typing, knitting, dressmaking, civics, art, lip reading, leather tooling, home beautification, English, Americanization and parent education.

There are now 285 adult education classes being taught in Oregon, with 10,425 persons attending every week.
