

SCOUTS WILL HOLD CIRCUS AT EUGENE

Roseburg Youths Will Take
Part in Annual Program
Set for May 16.

EUGENE, Ore., May 8.—Boy Scouts of the Wallamet council, from Eugene, Bandon, Cottage Grove, Creswell, Corvallis, Roseburg, Marshfield, Philomath and other localities, will join forces, May 16, for what is declared certain to be the outstanding Boy Scout circus in this history of this section of the state. It was declared here by L. A. Payne, chairman for the event, and H. B. Salove, scout executive.

More than 1,000 boys have been assigned places in the seven major acts that will be presented in huge McArthur court, on the University of Oregon campus, the program, details of which have now been worked out, show. The various attractions have been in rehearsal, under the direction of scout masters and troop committeemen, for several weeks, and all will be ready for the big event.

The circus will open this year with a huge pageant and grand entrance, in which the scouts will appear in uniform and in various formations. This will be followed by colorful signaling, in which all troops will participate, and will include wig-wag, flashlight signaling, and other forms of communication.

For the third act five-man teams will compete in firebuilding by flint and steel and by friction. A number of scouts have been practicing steadily, and new records are expected to be set in this event.

A new feature, a humorous act to feature clowns and other characters in unusual and odd antics, will be introduced as act four. This presentation is expected to be one of the features of the evening.

The thrilling chariot races which every year bring the huge audience to their feet cheering, will be the fifth event on the program. A record number of teams have already signified their intention of entering and competition is expected to be unusually keen this year.

The pioneering act will be allowed 40 minutes this year, and the thrilling events of the early days, as well as authentic customs and garb. All troops will participate in this event, and care to make everything authentic has been taken.

All scouts will join in singing the Oregon song, "Land of the Empire Builders," as a grand finale of the circus.

Scouts, sponsors and their friends are also out to set a new record for attendance this year, especially since the circus is expected to be more elaborate and greater in every way than ever before, Mr. Payne declares.

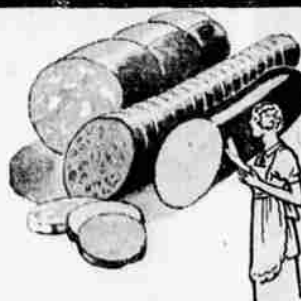
