Health Talks

DR. IAGO GLADSTON

Psychologic Infection
 Of all the infections, there is a psychologic nature spread most rapidly. In witness of this may be taken the extreme example of panic, which may affect a large number of persons within literally a fraction of a minute.

The infectiousness of psychologic states is but little appreciated, except perhaps in that rather vague manner which leads most of us to avoid contact with "bloomy Guses."

An evening spent at a problem play is likely to have its depressing effects, and when one is already burdened with one's own troubles, to take on those of the play is to add to one's load. Certain literature of a pessimistic and depressing nature may be read with impunity when spirits are high and one's perspective is long. But, perused in a state of psychologic depression, they are likely to intensify the feeling.

Parentetically, however, it should be added that sometimes depressing literature read precisely at a time when the reader is depressed, may have quite the opposite effect, following the principle of "like cures like."

Since many of us are cyclical in our moods, swinging like a slow-moving pendulum from moderate exuberance to mild depression, an intensification of the "downward swing" may the sooner induce a reversal of mood.

In this connection it should be borne in mind that happy elation is as infectious as depression. Deliberate exposure of oneself to beauty, goodness or humor may effect an improvement of mood and temper.

This thesis has particular validity in relation to the young and immature mind. It particularly warrants, without touching on the question of freedom of thought, censorship, etc., the keeping out of the reach of the immature books which are pessimistic and depressing, and devoted to the seamy side of life and experience.

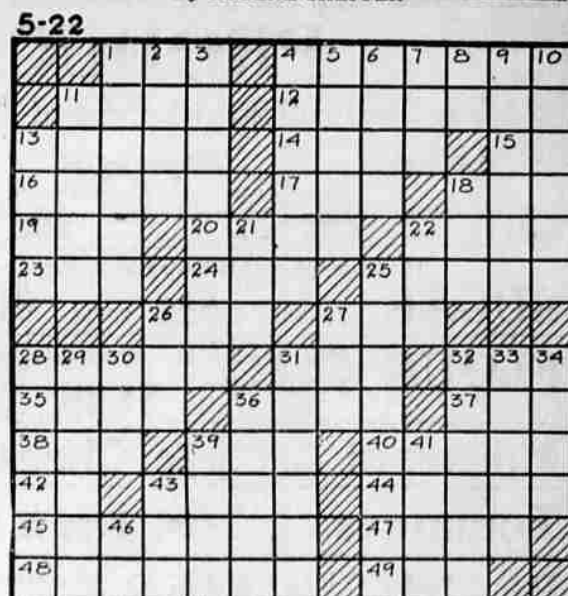

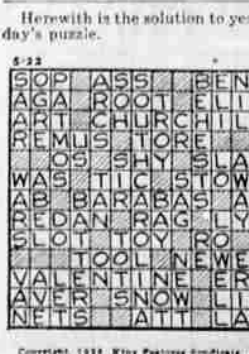
