## "Old Guard" Marshalls Forces

While rumors circulated regarding possible "rejuvenation" of the Republican party, signs of the times, such as the recent political triumphs in Connecticut of J. Henry Roraback, indicate that the G. O. P. Old Guard is in little danger of being dethroned when the party's national convention convenes in Cleveland on June 9. Allied with Roraback, who was just elected state central committee chairman for his fourteenth term and returned as member of the national committee for the fifth time, are Charles Hilles of New York and Henry P. Fletcher, national committee chairman. The Hilles-Roraback faction is estimated to control about 150 votes at the coming convention. They are traditionally allied with "big business" and are looked on as leaders of the opposition to any movement which may try and institute a "Republican New Deal".

MAY WEATHER HERE  
GOES ABOVE NORMAL

Weather during the month of May was above normal in temperature and rainfall, according to the monthly meteorological report by D. P. Marting, in charge of the U. S. weather bureau.

Mean temperature was 61 degrees, a daily excess of 4.8 degrees. Highest temperature was 90 degrees, May 19, and the lowest 35 degrees, May 7.

Precipitation totaled 2.75 inches as compared with a normal of 1.93 inches. Rainfall records show a wide variation in May precipitation, the month showing only slightly more than a trace in some years, while in others rainfall has amounted to more than four inches. For the current year rainfall from September 1, 1935, to May 31, 1936, totaled 32.65 inches as compared with a normal for that period of 31.31 inches, a seasonal excess of 1.34 inches. The excess since January 1, 1936, amounts to 2.50 inches.
