FEDERAL TELEPHONE INQUIRY HALTED

WASHINGTON, June 11.—(AP)—The federal communication commission's \$750,000 investigation of the huge American Telephone and Telegraph company came to a halt today amid forecasts from informed sources that it would not be resumed until late summer.

Testimony on stock ownership in the A. T. & T. concluded the recent series of hearings yesterday. Dr. N. R. Danielian, expert witness for the investigators, said leaders in the telephone industry had stressed "the large number of stockholders and their small holdings," but had failed to reveal that "five per cent of all stockholders owned 50 per cent" of the stock.

The witness said this had been done to "create goodwill" and aid telephone leaders in their contacts with legislative committees. Danielian contended speeches, advertisements, and other information by telephone leaders emphasizing the stock held by "small investors, particularly housewives, were based upon 'statistical legendry'."

FCC spokesman said the present investigation was ordered to determine if federal regulation of rates and practices of the telephone industry was necessary.

WOMAN LAUNCHES BOOM FOR HOOVER

CLEVELAND, June 11.—(AP)—Mrs. Frances J. Clair, a platinum blonde from New York City, embarked today on a one-woman campaign to reelect Herbert Hoover president of the United States.

Bearing three orchids instead of a delegate's badge, the pretty New Yorker jumped from her gallery seat and ran to the floor when the former president entered the republican national convention last night.

"Let me by," she cried, as she swept down the crowded aisle, side tripping burly ushers, and reaching the foot of the speaker's platform.

"We want Hoover!" she shouted, looking up at the smiling Californian.

She seized an American flag from the stand, mounted a chair beside John Hamilton, campaign manager for Gov. Alf M. Landon, and began to wave the flag and shout Hoover's name.

"Here, gimme that flag, you can't do that," said an usher. "Well, maybe I can't, but I've got it," replied Mrs. Clair, waving. After the crowd and quieted its cheers for the former president and Hoover had finished his speech, Mrs. Clair renewed the cry, "We want Hoover," to which the band kept time as other delegates smilingly joined in.

As the convention recessed her orchids were faded and her right hand blistered from waving her flag. Hoover admirers clustered about her.

"You started something," said a bald-headed fat man.

"Yes," she answered, "and I'm going to keep it up until I get him elected."

Mrs. Clair confided that she had admired Hoover for "many years."
