FARMERS RESPOND TO SOIL PROGRAM

CORVALLIS—Oregon counties as a whole fared well in the setting of Class I rates under the new federal agricultural conservation program, reports F. L. Ballard, vice-director of extension at O. S. C., who was in Washington at the time the rates were decided upon. The fact that average yields of staple crops in Oregon are considerably higher than the national average served to put the basic rates per acre for most counties above the \$10 national average.

Farmers in most sections of the country have responded even more heartily than expected to the new program, Ballard found, despite the admitted weak points it contains largely as a result of the haste necessary in developing and introducing it.
