

ADMIRER GRILLED IN WOMAN MURDER

CHICAGO, June 30.—(AP)—A handwriting expert was placed on the trail of the slayer of Mrs. Florence Thompson Castle today as investigators renewed their interrogation of an admirer of the pretty night club entertainer.

Herbert J. Walter was called in to the case to study a bizarre message scrawled in lipstick on a mirror in the victim's hotel room. It read: "Black Legion game"—interpreted to mean "Black Legion game." Subjoined was a printed skull and cross bones.

Chief of Detectives J. L. Sullivan—terming it one of a number of "intentionally misleading clues" left by the man who crushed Mrs. Castle's skull with a paving brick early yesterday as she lay in bed beside her seven-year-old son—asked Walter to compare the note with handwriting of persons questioned in the case.

Sullivan announced James D. Britt, a Stevens Point, Wis., furrier, was sought for interrogation. He said Britt had resided at the same hotel as Mrs. Castle this month and had entertained her at a night club. A man registered under that name, the chief added, had checked out of a loop hotel last night.

Sidney Schaps, 32, master of ceremonies at a north side cafe who listed himself as a "good friend" of the brunette hostess, was held for a new quiz after he had submitted to a lie detector test. Captain William O'Brien said Schaps was "shaky on all his answers about his activities" Sunday night.

Mrs. Nancy Polfus, mother of the 24-year-old victim, told police Schaps was jealous of her daughter and had threatened her.

Young James, 7, the investigator it was about 12 a. m. Monday when a man who resembled a negro crawled in the window and beat and choked his mother. He demanded to know from the horrified boy: "Who were you and your mother out with last night?"

It was the official theory that the slayer had covered his face with black grease paint and affected a negro dialect to frustrate identification by the boy who watched the grotesque crime.

MAN, WIFE SLAIN, 2 OTHERS BEATEN

OGDEN, Utah, June 30.—(AP)—A gray-haired man and his wife were beaten to death in their beds here today as their 8-year-old deaf-mute daughter looked on.

The dead are Adam Snyder, 62, and Mrs. Mabel Scott Snyder, 52. Mrs. Emma Scott Rose, 80, mother of Mrs. Snyder, was beaten so badly she was not expected to live.

A visitor, Mrs. Grace Mortensen, 35, of Salt Lake City, was badly cut and bruised.

Police, shocked at the sanguinary picture presented in the Snyder home, could obtain little help from the child witness to the brutal crimes, curly-haired Betty Becker.

They said they were seeking George Mortensen, 37, husband of Mrs. Grace Mortensen, for questioning.

The victims were bludgeoned with a pick-handle.

Police Sergeant L. M. Hilton

said Mrs. Mortensen told him her husband, a cosmetic salesman, "drank too much" and that she left home in Salt Lake City Sunday to come to her mother, Mrs. Snyder. She said, Hilton asserted, that Mortensen had followed her here and that she told him she would not return with him until he stopped drinking. They discussed the matter for some time, before retiring.

Mortensen then went to sleep on the couch in the front room, Hilton said he learned.

The deaf-mute child, a daughter of Mrs. Mortensen by a former marriage, ran to a nearby store operated by Mrs. John Sabine, shortly after 7 a. m.—about an hour, police conjectured, after the killings.

With difficulty, she finally made the woman understand and police were called.

ROOSEVELT SIGNS FORTY-HOUR LAW

WASHINGTON, June 30.—(AP)—Legislation requiring firms which sell goods to the government to comply with the 40-hour work week and other labor regulations was signed into law today by President Roosevelt.

Known as the Walsh-Healey bill, the measure was pushed through the closing hours of congress after the American Federation of Labor had made a strong appeal for its passage.

Proponents have estimated that it will affect 75 per cent of the nation's business. They have denied, however, that it constitutes an attempt to "revive" the NRA.

Under the new law those who sell goods and materials to government agencies, in amounts of \$10,000 or more not purchasable ordinarily on the open market, must conform to labor requirements written into their contracts.

These will include a maximum working day of eight hours and a maximum work week of 40 hours; payment of wage rates prevailing in the locality; employment of no boys under 18 nor girls under 16; banning of sweat-shop, convict and home-work labor; factory sanitation at least equal to that required under state law; and outlawing of wage "kick-backs" to contractors by the workers.

The law applies only to the principal contractors, instead of also affecting sub-contractors as did the original measure passed by the senate a year ago.

The law complements the Bacon-Davis act requiring payment of prevailing wages by contractors on government construction.
