DRUNKEN DRIVING
TOPS REVOCATIONS

SALEM, July 23.—(AP)—Revocations and suspensions of automobile drivers' licenses passed the hundred mark for one month during June, the secretary of state's office reported today.

Of the record number of 121 most revocations were listed for driving while intoxicated. This violation accounted for 75 revocations alone, while two licenses were revoked for hit and run driving.

Reckless driving accounted for 25 suspensions of drivers' permits. The number of convictions for traffic violations in Oregon's courts the past month totaled 752.

During the past 11 months, 441 automobile drivers had their licenses revoked for driving while intoxicated. Total revocations and suspensions during that period was 493.

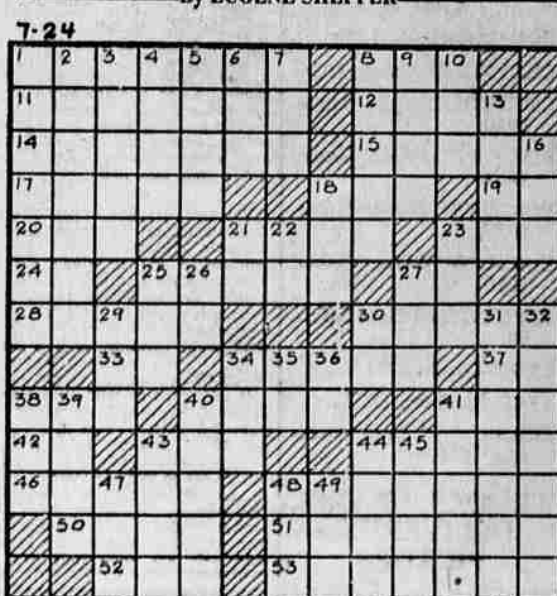
