FARM DEBT TERMS 5 farm p Creditors who violate their scale-down agreements entered into with farmers as a condition to the financing of old indebtedness with land bank or land bank commissioner's loans not only have no legal grounds for collecting, but furthermore they may be subject to criminal prosecution.

Chemically-Treated Water Takes Place Of Soil in Production of Vegetables and Fruit by U. of California Experimenters

BERKELEY, Calif. (AP)—For seven years Dr. W. F. Gericko of the University of California has been demonstrating that you don't need a farm to be a farmer.

He has installed his equipment in tomato greenhouses in Capitola and Montebello, Calif., and has arranged for nurseries in other parts of the country to try it with varied crops.

"Revolutionary" Process "This water-growing process is revolutionary—the discovery of a new continent," he exclaims.

From these tests I hope to obtain sufficient information to prepare directions for raising any crop, and I will make these directions available to the people. The method will be for unrestricted use. It is something which, by its very nature, cannot be monopolized.
