IMPORTS INSPECTION BY OREGON ADVISED

MEDFORD, July 28.—(AP)—Inspection of fruits and farm products at the Oregon line to protect Oregon growers against the importation of inferior products should be started by the state, the Jackson county chamber of commerce told Gov. Martin.
Olen Arnsperger, president, said it was not designed as a retaliatory move to California's present inspection system and would be confined to produce trucks. Other civic organizations were invited to join in the move.

DRUNKENNESS TOPS CAUSES OF ARREST

SALEM, July 28.—(AP)—Superintendent Charles P. Pray's state police report for June revealed 287 arrests, including one on a murder charge.

Most arrests and heaviest fines were recorded for drunkenness, while statutory charges led in the highest number of prison sentences.

In the game law division 178 arrests were reported resulting in fines of \$5,438. Violation of commercial fishing regulations brought heaviest fines while angling violations resulted in the largest number of arrests.

The traffic department, as in the past, led in the number of activities, 675 arrests being reported with \$8,530 in fines for the month and \$1,172 in fees collected. Failure to possess driver's licenses caused 192 arrests while the 33 arrests made on charges of driving while intoxicated resulted in fines of \$3,062.

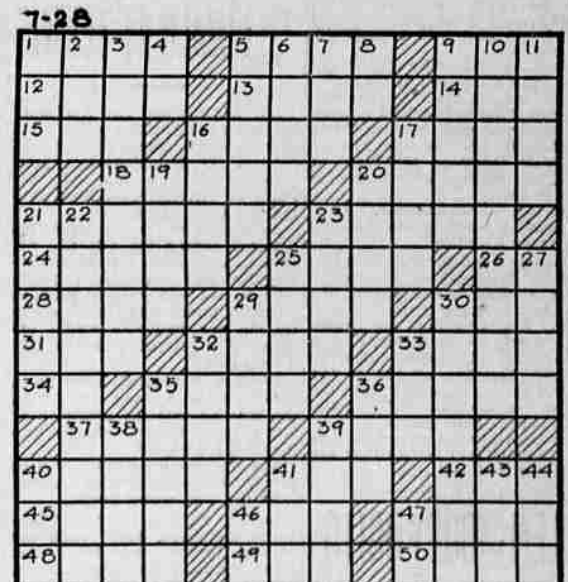
