NEW CAPITOL JOB TO BEGIN IN SEPT.

SALEM, Aug. 7.—(AP)—Actual construction work on the new state capitol project will start shortly after September 2, when bids for preliminary work will be opened, J. A. McLean of Eugene, chairman of the capitol reconstruction committee, advised state officials here yesterday.

Bids will be called for immediately, McLean said. The work will include clearing the tract, erecting a fence around the building area, erecting field houses for use of the supervising architects and the WPA inspectors, and excavating the basement for the new building. The bids will not include construction of the building itself. McLean said contracts for erection of the capitol building would probably be made in November and that construction work would be under way by early December. McLean was accompanied on a check of the capitol site yesterday

BOBCAT TREADED BY IRATE MOTHER DEER

New strength to Kipling's theory that the female of the species is always a foe to her cocked with was added recently by Earl Huff, of Allison ranger station on the Ochoco national forest southeast of Prineville, Oregon.

Huff was hurrying home through the forest when some animal dashed across the road ahead of his car, followed closely by a deer. Huff's first thought was that he had seen a fawn followed by its mother. But fawns do not ordinarily lead the family procession even in this unconventional age, he reflected.

Stopping his car, he found the doe standing beside a nearby tree and evidently all "fussed up" about something which she failed to disclose. No fawn was in sight.

At that moment a full grown bobcat jumped out of the small pine which the doe was facing and dashed off with the deer in hot pursuit. The angry doe pressed the cat so hard that he treed again in less than a hundred yards and the forester had to leave before the final round of this strange woodland combat was decided.

Doubtless the doe had a fawn nearby and had determined to clear the neighborhood of unwelcome visitors. "I have known deer to chase dogs away from their fawns," said Huff, "and if a dog is wise he will not start an argument with a mother deer, but I never knew a deer to put a wildcat up a tree and, what is more, insist that he stay there."
