parade winds its way through the main part of town starting at 8:15 p. m. Thursday, for it will be one of the greatest spectacles ever seen here.

More than 1,000 men and women, Legion and auxiliary members, are expected to be in marching groups, while other hundreds will ride in cars or upon floats.

The task of arranging details of such an event presents many difficult problems, but the committee headed by Mr. Bashford has the arrangements well outlined, definite assignments made for each department, and a system established which will enable the parade to be staged without confusion or disorder.

Three main sections will be provided in the organization of the parade.

Parade Formation
The first section will include state department colors and banners, with the national guard company as guard and escort. The Roseburg school band will provide the music for this section, which also will include state officers and outstanding convention visitors riding in cars. The entire section will be led by a police escort.

The second section will be made up of marching men and women, grouped according to the respective American Legion districts of the state, and with bands and drum corps interspersed at intervals. Included in this section will be the fun department of the 40 and 8.

The third and final section will be made up of floats entered by civic organizations and will include music by the Umpqua post American Legion drum corps and the Roseburg Municipal band.

The parade is to form on Mill, Pine and Burke streets in the south part of town, and will traverse Stephens street to Lane, Lane to Sheridan, Sheridan to Cass, Cass to Jackson, and Jackson to Winchester and Second avenue South.

The entire route will be lighted with red flares, which will add to the brilliantly colored uniforms and the glistening helmets of the bands, drum corps and other uniformed bodies.

**VEGETABLE COLOR
SETTING ADVISED**

Homemakers who can green vegetables are often disappointed to find that the canned product has lost its fresh natural green color and taken on a faded and somewhat brownish hue.

This loss of color in such vegetables as new peas and green beans, spinach and others is due to the high temperature necessary in canning. Miss Lucy Cast, extension specialist in foods and nutrition at Oregon State college, explains. Chlorophyll, the green substance in plants, is sensitive to acid during cooking, she points out, and most vegetables contain some acid which the heat of cooking or canning drives out. In an open saucepan, this acid passes off with the steam, but in a sealed can it attacks the green color.

Recent investigations have shown that if the green vegetable is pre-cooked at low temperatures, between 160 and 180 degrees, the color seems to "set" so that when the vegetable is put in the can and exposed to the high heat of processing, it will not fade so badly.

The new way, then, is first to cook green vegetables a short time in a saucepan with water, keeping the temperature at or below simmering point, Miss Cast says. Then put the hot vegetable immediately into sterilized hot containers and process under steam pressure. Fast results with greens are reported from pre-cooking until they wilt; with green beans, until they bend without breaking; and with young tender peas, about five minutes.

**FORCED MOLTING
FOR HENS FUTILE**

Attempts to improve on nature's season for laying hens to renew their feathers in preparation for the following winter have not proved profitable under Oregon conditions, according to a brief bulletin by Frank L. Knowlton, poultry husbandman at Oregon State college, just off the press.

The bulletin reports on the results of experiments conducted during two seasons with forced molting of White Leghorn hens. Several other states have conducted the tests with conflicting results, giving rise to requests on the part of Oregon poultrymen to

find out how the plan would work under western conditions.

Knowlton concluded from his tests that forced molting, which is accomplished by a radical variation in diet and environmental factors, cannot be recommended as a dependable method of increasing the income from egg production. The theory is that, by forcing early molting while large eggs are low in price, a profitable production of higher priced fall eggs can be induced. It was found, however, that the mortality of force molted birds was high and that severe culling was necessary in order to keep flock production above 50 per cent.

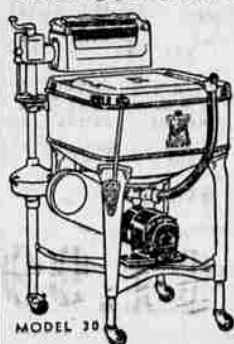

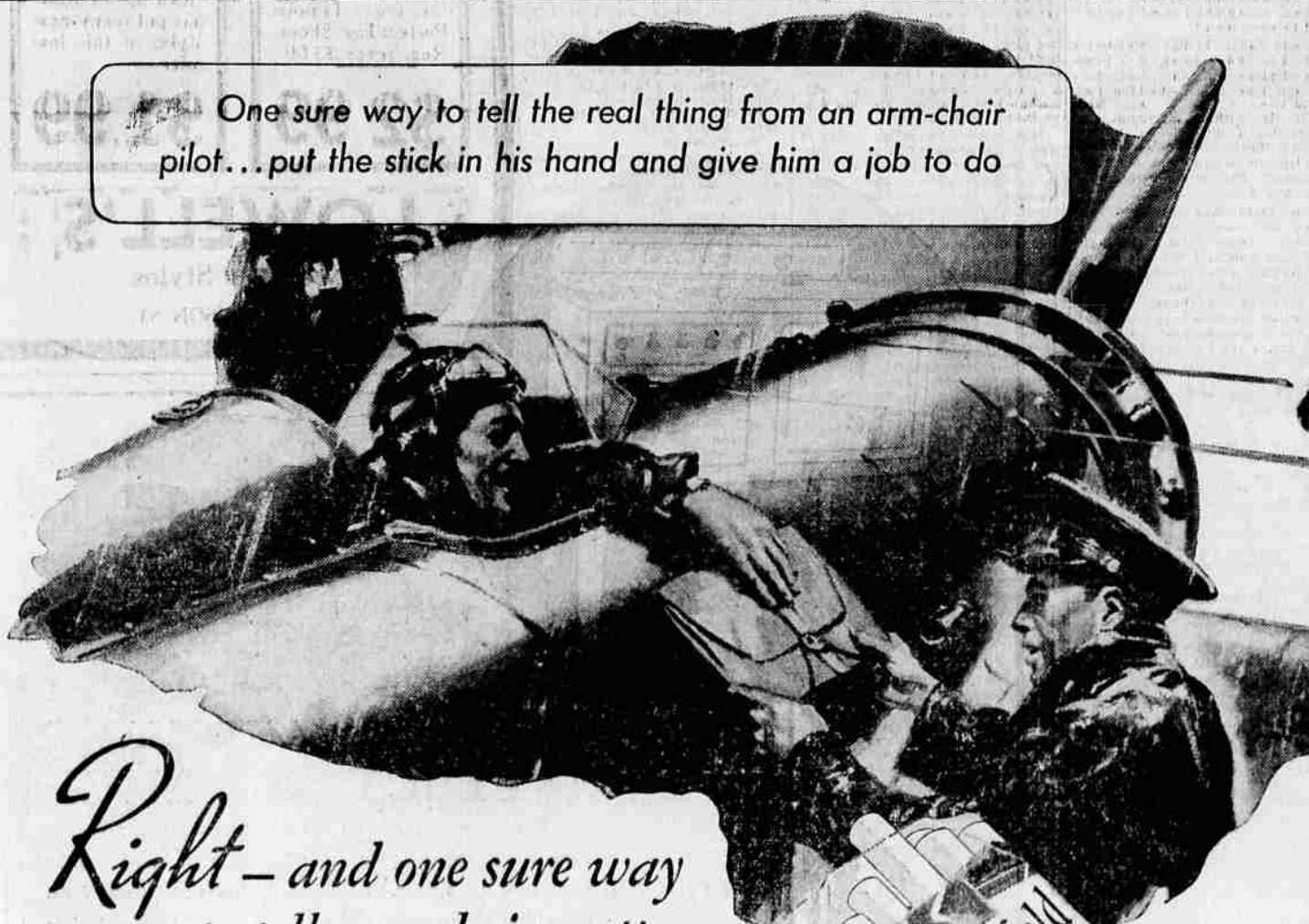
