DEMAND FOR OREGON SEED INCREASING

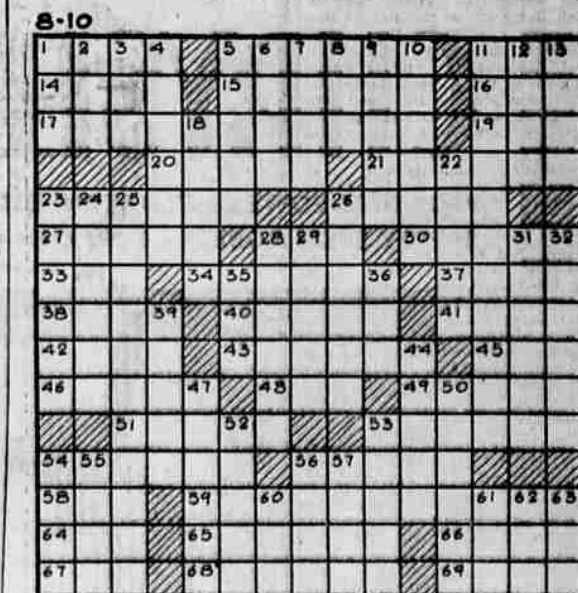
The severe and continued drought in the middle west has had marked effect upon future field seed supplies, reports E. R. Jackman, extension agronomist at Oregon State college. In many cases, alfalfa, clover and grass crops in the drought area have been practically ruined, which will doubtless have its effect on prices for the 1936 supplies.

Oregon raises a large tonnage of field seeds now, and will probably be called upon to supply a larger proportion of the country's needs than usual. Seed crops of which Oregon has a virtual monopoly

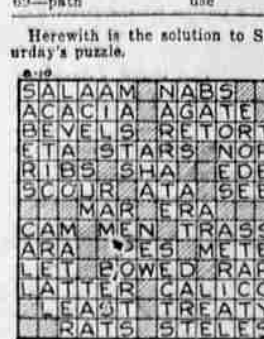
