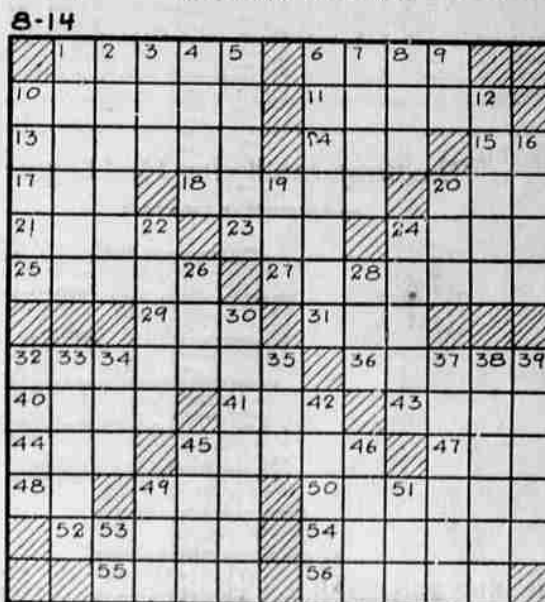
Wins \$90,000 Alimony Award
