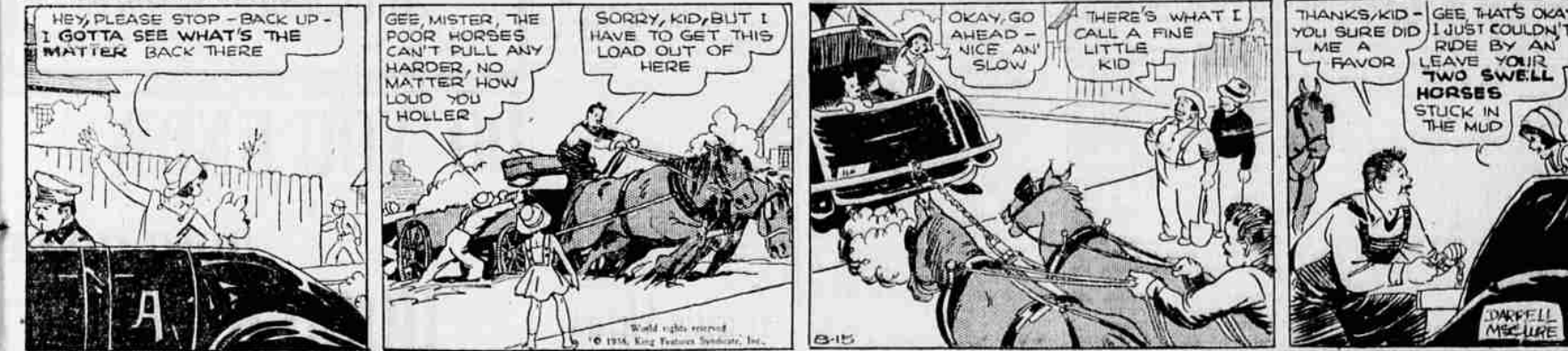

## POLLY AND HER PALS

RESERVE BANKING  
SYSTEM SCORED

CLEVELAND, Aug. 14.—(AP)—The opening session of the Rev. Charles E. Coughlin's national union for social justice convention cheered wildly today an assertion by West Virginia's youthful senator, Hugh D. Holt, that "the money changers have not been driven from the temple."

The 31-year-old senator, a democrat, making the keynote address of the convention, brought delegates to their feet with this reference to the sixth of Father Coughlin's 16 points—abolition of the federal reserve banking system.

"I can quote no better than from William Jennings Bryan," said Holt. "Bryan said in 1923, 'the federal reserve bank that should have been the farmer's greatest protection has become his greatest foe.'"

"If the Wall street speculators are in control of it, it would be better to repeal it," Holt said.

He upheld attempts to "raise the mortgage burden of the farmer," which he said had brought cries of "inflation."

Referring to the principle of "a just and living wage," Holt said, "one cannot subscribe to people being misled in a land that produces so much cotton that it has to be plowed under. One cannot subscribe to people being hungry in a land which prohibits production of corn, wheat and other food stuffs. A sound, economic system does not tolerate millions of unemployed."

"It is my prediction that more members of congress will be for the Frazier-Lemke bill in the next session than in the last," he said. Attacking those who say wages and hours cannot be regulated without a constitutional amendment, he said, "yet those so-called great friends of labor have not submitted a constitutional amendment on unfair wages and long hours."

ST. PAUL, Aug. 14.—(AP)—Rain abated the northern Minnesota forest fire danger somewhat today as showers added fire fighters in subduing all brush, peat, and bog fires in at least one area—Hibbing.

Minnesota's three principal congressional districts were checked for the time being.

SPokane, Wash., Aug. 14.—(AP)—Severe lightning storms and a new Canadian forest fire menaced timberlands of north Idaho and northwestern Montana today, after the forest service had reported all fires under control and started reducing crews.

The Spokane warehouse of the forest service received a report of a new fire on the Canadian border between Kinsgate, B. C. and Port Hill, west of where the Hunter mountain blaze has raged for several days. A spread of the flames would endanger the Kankana forest.
