

RUSSO-JAP WAR APPEARS NEARING

Impending Clash Indicated by Alignments Among European Nations.

NEW YORK, Aug. 25.—(AP)—Three developments have given rise to concern as to whether the frequently predicted Russo-Japanese war is approaching:

1. The initial success of Admiral Horthy, Hungarian regent, in his efforts to create a strong anti-soviet front of middle European nations, including Germany.
2. The report from Berlin that the German government is about to double compulsory military service to two years because of "Russian militarism."
3. The Russian charge that Germany and Japan are about to conclude an alliance and are riding for war.

Admiral Horthy, en route for a hunting trip in the Austrian Alps, went quietly into Bavaria last week-end for a "secret" conference with Adolf Hitler, who has been working vigorously along similar lines and who recently renewed his attack on Russia because of soviet activities in connection with the Spanish revolt.

The Nazi dictator is said to have given Horthy his support for a proposed tripartite parity, among Germany, Austria and Hungary to plan an anti-bolshevik drive. Moscow already has called Poland a potential enemy and an ally of Germany.

Only three weeks ago the soviet press charged that Germany was trying to effect this very line-up, with wartime intentions. The newspapers revived the report which has been circulating throughout Europe that there was an alliance between Germany and Japan for concerted action against Russia.

Whether such an alliance exists or is in prospect, it is obvious that Russia is sitting between the jaws of a powerful vise which might start squeezing at any time.

Both Russia and Japan are being talked into the probability of war between them, and just as openly have been rushing military preparations to meet any eventuality.

Nazis Aim at Reds

Germany has indicated two objectives if she should engage in a war against Russia: The elimination of what the reich calls the communistic menace to Europe, and territorial expansion at the expense of Russia.

The Russian territory most often cited in Berlin is the rich Ukraine. Germans have been mentioning this freely as compensation to Poland for the return of the Polish corridor, Danzig, Memel, and perhaps upper Silesia.

Because of Poland's geographical position between Germany and Russia, her assistance would be vital to Hitler in event of war. The Polish army, reconstituted and re-armed by the late Marshal Pilsudski, is held to be one of the crack fighting units of Europe.

Poland never has shown any great love for Germany, but Warsaw is much more afraid of Russia than the reich.

Japan's Temper Shown

While the barricade of alliances is being erected on the western border of Russia, and while Hitler continues to shoot his barbed shafts at Moscow, the Japanese are proceeding vigorously with their anti-soviet crusade in the far east.

A striking indication of the temper in the orient was given yesterday when Japan's army headquarters in Hsinking, Manchoukuo, announced that nine alleged soviet citizens had been executed at Hlar and 28 others sentenced to prison on the charge of subversive activities.

Hitler nestles in a hotly disputed boundary region—near the junction of the Japanese sponsored state of Manchoukuo and the republic of Mongolia, which is under soviet influence, and Siberia. There have been many untoward incidents in this region.

Russia has concentrated troops and the readiness of war on her eastern seaboard. She has created great air and submarine bases, and has perfected her communications across Siberia.

Nippon has consolidated her position in Manchoukuo and northern China and has strengthened her forces on the mainland. She has been working overtime on her naval and air equipment.

Alliances Eye

The question of what attitude would be adopted by other Euro-

pean nations in event of a Russo-Japanese-Germanic war is one which probably the heads of states themselves could not answer at this time.

Moscow has charged that there is a secret understanding between Germany and Italy. However that may be, the once open hostility between Dictators Hitler and Mussolini has given way to an armistice which appears not to be lacking in friendliness.

France has her alliance with Russia, and the former's distrust of Germany has increased under the Hitler regime with its abrogation of treaties and such moves as the occupation of the Rhineland. Britain would do her best to stay out of the war, but admits that neutrality would be a near impossibility.

Japan would hesitate to embark on such a war without first having assured herself that both Britain and the United States would keep hands off, or at least would not enter the lists against her.

COMPETITION ABUSE HIT BY RICHBERG

Ethical Standards Advised Of Bar Assn.; Political Speech Halted.

BOSTON, Aug. 25.—(AP)—Donald R. Richberg, one time head of the now defunct N.R.A., told the American Bar association today that if the country were to preserve the essentials of its present economic system, it must rid it of "the excesses and abuses of unrestrained competition."

"The difficulties of regulating competition did not begin or end with the N.R.A.," said Richberg, "although from the course of lamentations and hallelujahs which began in Washington and reverberated throughout the nation, one might have thought that trade and industry were getting a new religion."

"We might remove some of the evils of competition by working out ethical standards of just compensation. But if we attempt to legislate morality into legal obligation we will end the competitive system; because we cannot legislate an infinite variety of compensations for an infinite variety of services."

A series of resolutions designed to place the bar association on record either favoring or opposing the proposed federal child labor amendment awaited consideration.

Press Asked to Aid

Thomas D. Thacher, former solicitor general of the United States, called upon the press of the nation today to support the American Bar association in ridding the courts of the publicity evil.

Referring to the Hauptmann murder trial as "the most shocking example of the evil practices which have surrounded the trial of sensational cases in this country for many years," Thacher called for a halt "upon the sensational outpourings of emotion and prejudice."
