W. H. Wann, official auditor for Douglas county, who has been in Roseburg several weeks conducting a school audit, spoke yesterday on the subject of gold and gold coins. Wann has a hobby of coin collecting and told of the development of coinage in America.

Dexter Rice, chairman of the Oregon game commission, told of the work the commission is doing in fish and game replenishing this year. The game commission is carrying on its work with an increased load and at the same time liquidating indebtedness and building up a reserve.
