TOWNSENDITES PUT O.K. ON CANDIDATES

Reaching a decision to limit endorsements to candidates for legislative offices, following a series of conferences on the question, the Douglas County Council of Townsendites has endorsed Willie Mahoney as candidate for U. S. senator from Oregon, and J. W. Mott as congressman from the first district, according to an announcement today by Clyde S. Shaw of Roseburg, district manager for Townsend clubs of Douglas, Coos and Curry counties.

For legislative posts from Douglas county the council's endorsement is given Mayor C. W. Clark of Roseburg, republican candidate for state senator, and Bernard Young, republican, Roseburg, and William Garner, democrat, Yoncalla, for state representative.

The question of endorsement for candidates for county offices was seriously debated at several conferences, Shaw reports, but the council finally decided that the Townsend plan is concerned only with legislation and that the endorsement should therefore be limited to candidates for legislative posts.

The council is composed of three representatives from each of the 27 Townsend clubs of Douglas county. The clubs have a combined membership of approximately 5,000 persons.
