

MARITIME TRUCE ATTEMPTS FAIL

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 22.—(AP)—Rear Admiral Harry G. Hamlet, federal maritime commission representative, went ahead today with plans to start hearings in the employer-employee dispute involving Pacific coast waterfronts, after indicating attempts to effect a one-year truce had failed.

Hamlet said he would start hearings next Monday, when the maritime commission officially comes into existence.

Shipowners at first agreed to the

year's truce, Hamlet said in a statement last night, but the unions asked certain changes in the old working agreements, after which the shipowners requested that the matter "go along to an investigation of the entire situation as originally promised by the maritime commission."

The hope was held out, however, by T. Huntington Morse, Hamlet's associate, that a basis might be found later for an extension of the truce. Union leaders declined to comment on Hamlet's statement, and continued taking ballots among their membership on the question of authorizing their joint negotiating committee to call a coastwide strike of all maritime unions next Wednesday.

Present working agreements were to have expired last September 30, but have been continued under a truce which the unions have sanctioned only until next Monday.

ECONOMIC 'CURES' HIT BY EDUCATOR

SALEM, Oct. 21.—(AP)—Most economic panaceas such as the Townsend old age pension plan, the share-the-wealth plan, the triple A and others fail because they do not distinguish between money and wealth, W. C. Jones, professor of economics at Williamette university, said in a forum discourse here.

The Townsend plan, he said, fails to make the distinction for it would give eight per cent of the population \$24,000,000,000 a year to be converted immediately into goods and services. But, he said, as the greatest aggregate wealth this country has ever produced, \$79,000,000,000 it means 30 per cent of the wealth would be in the hands of eight per cent requiring a 30 per cent tax of all production.

The share-the-wealth plan fails to consider there is not as much as \$3,000 to \$5,000 per person wealth in this country, but only \$675 per person, Professor Jones said.

Of the triple A proposal, Jones said "it is a marvelous plan for the farmers; that of transferring money from the pockets of city folks to the pockets of country folks."

Concluding, he said, "there is no substitute in economic organization under a democracy for an intelligent citizenship." Other points urged by the speaker were elimination of war, control of the business cycle, and utmost development of productive capacities of the people.
