A short lecturers' program following the business session included reading by Mrs. Ted Hodges, vocal solos by Mariel Howard and violin selections by Claire Meredith.

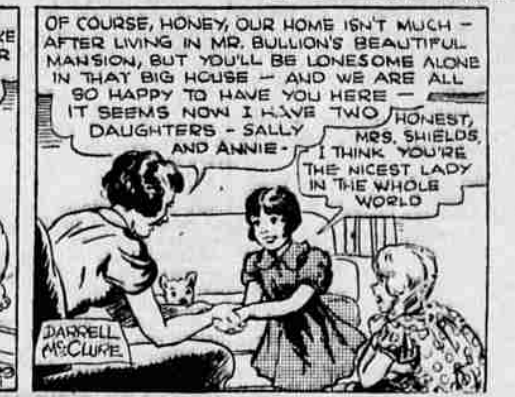
Refreshments of pumpkin pie and apple cider were served at a late hour by the ladies of the home economics committee.

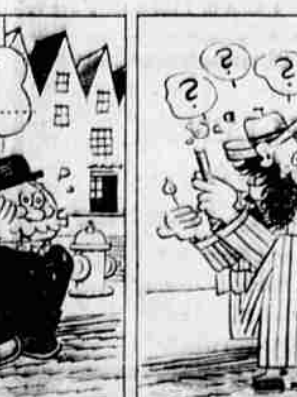
