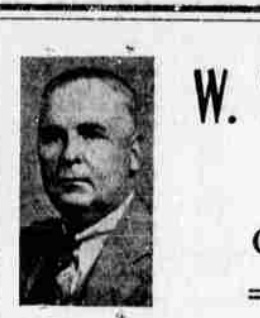
ELLIOTT FUNERAL SET FOR SATURDAY
