EFFORT TO 'SMEAR' LONDON SQUELCHED

Correct Status of Kansas Schools Pointed Out by Emporia Editor.

BOSTON, Oct. 29.—(AP)—William Allen White, editor of the Emporia (Kansas) Gazette, called "a pure fake" what he said was a campaign by the democratic national committee to "smear London" through an attack on the Kansas common school system.

The Kansas school question was discussed over the radio here recently by James Roosevelt, eldest son of the president, who accused Gov. Alf M. Landon, republican presidential nominee, of neglecting the state's school system.

White, here to address a meeting, said:

"The democratic national committee has conducted a campaign of pure fake on the Kansas common school system in order to smear London."

"It has a basis in the fact that we have 400—more or less—vacant school houses that once housed 8,000 children. These closed school houses represent a school union or consolidation movement due to two things:

"Good roads which make it easy to operate a school bus and take children from little one-room school houses to larger three and four room houses."

"The second factor in the school union is the fact that in western Kansas, the so-called dust-bowl section, many families have moved away leaving school districts containing one or two children. It is both cheaper and more efficient to send a bus through three or four such districts and collect the children in one large well-equipped school."

"Kansas spends on her common schools more per pupil than the average 'prairie state' and has more high school and college students than a vast majority of the American states."

BOSTON, Oct. 30.—(AP)—The Commercial Bulletin will say tomorrow:

"There is a distinctly broader market. Sales these last ten days are estimated at 20,000,000 pounds. Almost everything in the shape of wool is in demand at somewhat stronger prices for the week. Top-makers and spinners are also realizing better prices and there is expected to be a better movement in piecegoods."

"Foreign markets are a cent or two higher, clean basis, for the week. There is general competition in Australia and America is buying considerable weight of wools there."

"There has been a clearance movement going on in the left-over wools in the west and stocks still unsold in the west have been moved to a remarkable extent."

"Mohair is in moderate demand and very firm."

PHONE CO. TO CUT INTERSTATE RATES

PORTLAND, Oct. 30.—(AP)—Filing of a new long distance telephone rate schedule for interstate calls was announced by N. R. Powley, president of the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company.

Savings to patrons were estimated at approximately \$290,000 annually. The new schedule will be filed with the federal communications commission to become effective on December 1.

Powley said the reduction was the third of the year. The estimated benefit to telephone users on the Pacific coast was figured at \$800,000.

"The maximum reductions for a three-minute conversation for the longest haul in our territory," Powley said, "approximate \$2.70 for day station-to-station service and \$4.60 for day person-to-person service."

Examples of reductions in a table accompanying Powley's statement were, for station-to-station service from San Francisco: to Portland, Ore., cut from \$3.45 to \$2.90; to Seattle, from \$4.15 to \$2.30; to Spokane, Wash., from \$4.65 to \$2.50.
