would go out in the blizzards of winter, sometimes at the risk of life, certainly at the cost of comfort, to locate stray cattle or horses, or to rescue those in danger. How much more should we be willing at the cost of comfort and convenience and money to go out to seek those men and women who are lost, he said. He told of riding home one evening tired and hungry and seeing away over the prairie a horse that seemed to be injured. He rode over and found it bleeding badly from barb-wire wounds. He rode many miles to tell the owner about it so that he could save his horse. He pleaded with his hearers to do at least as much for men and women "perishing on the range of life." He related a story of a homesteader's little girl in South Dakota who strayed away while her mother was working in the field, and how the neighbors for several miles around gave all of their time for two nights and most of two days, and even the store keepers in town closed their stores to help in the search, until the little tot was found and brought home rejoicing. How much more should we, Christians, be ready to sacrifice anything to find the lost and bring them home to God, he declared.

Mr. Eilers will appear in full cowboy costume tonight, and will speak on "Shooting Square." Saturday evening he will use what he
