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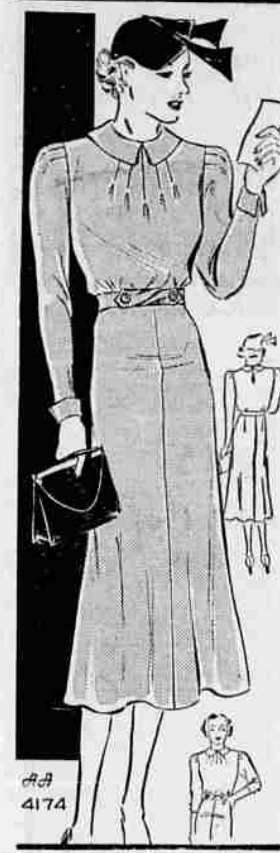


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PUBLIC INVITED TO SUNDAY EVENING PRAISE SERVICE, NOVEMBER 22

H. W. Swan, district commander, was present from Oregon City to pay the post an official visit.

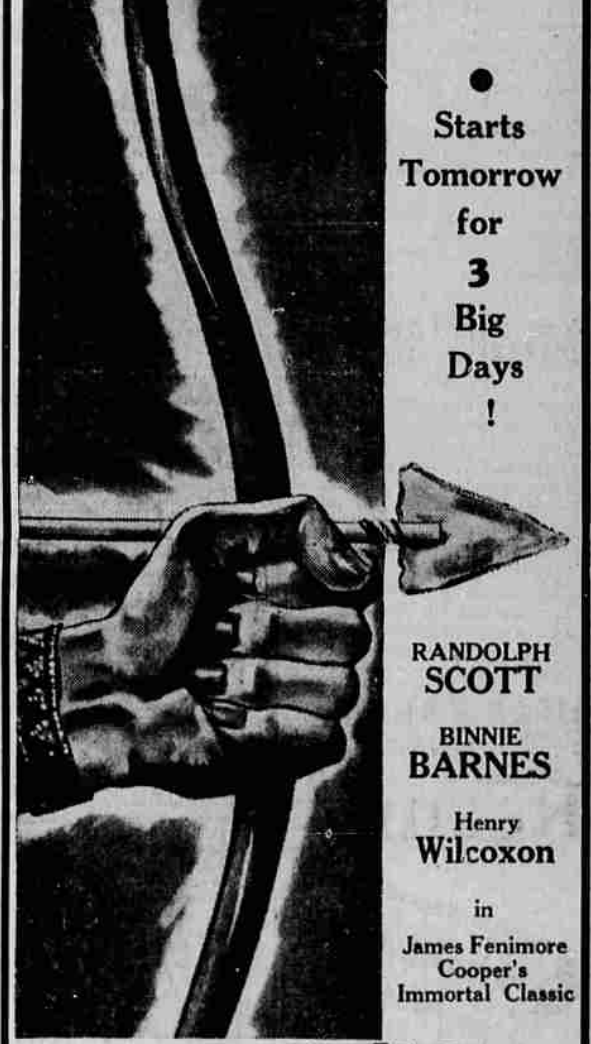
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
