1 pint green tomatoes run through food chopper
2 green peppers
2 red peppers

Mix together with 1 tablespoon salt, let stand awhile then drain and add one-half cup water. Boil until tender, then add one-half dozen pickles, sweet or sour, that have been run through food chopper. Keep this hot until dressing is made. Dressing:

1 cup sugar
1 tablespoon corn starch
2 tablespoons mustard
2 cup vinegar
1 cup salad oil

2 eggs well beaten (if desired)
Let come to boil, stirring constantly. Put all together and seal while hot.

Pickles may be omitted; 1 T to meric added.

Wash a good sized watermelon and chill thoroughly. Cut a slice from the smallest end to serve as a cover, take out most of the pulp and be careful not to leave any of the seeds. Make a strong lemonade seasoned with a little ginger syrup and pour into the melon. When serving put the lemonade with a glass of watermelon into a glass one-fourth full of cracked ice. Serve with straw.
