### UNION ASKS POLL OF STORE EMPLOYEES

**PORTLAND, Dec. 4.**—(AP)—Officials of the weavers, warehousemen and cereal workers union of the International Longshoremen's association will request the national labor relations board to conduct a poll determining the number of members at Montgomery Ward & Co.

This action was decided upon late yesterday at a conference of union leaders, workers' representatives and John D. Bullock of Chicago. Bullock is assistant manager of the firm's mail order operations.

The company executive said further discussions would follow after the federal board completes the results of the proposed check.

The issues were announced as wage, hour and working conditions in the shipping and receiving departments.

## SCHOOL DISTRICT MERGERS ORDERED

Official action to consolidate school districts No. 15 and 14 in the Days Creek area, pursuant to a vote of the patrons in these districts, was taken by the county boundary board at a meeting yesterday. A voted consolidation of districts 12 and 9; Glide and Peel, was held up, due to failure of the Glide district to submit tally sheets to the board. The consolidation, however, has been approved and final authorization will be made by the board after the official returns from the election in the Glide district are received. Consolidation of district 102 with Yoncalla, No. 32, was approved.

A minor change in boundaries between districts 136 and 144 in the Daughman district was authorized, with a section of land being transferred to district 144.

As district No. 129, Umpqua has lapsed, not having maintained a school for several years, it was divided between adjoining districts, 40, located west of Willard, and 84, the Tye district. A small sum remaining to the credit of the lapsed district was ordered divided on a basis of assessed valuation between district 40 and 84.

The Southeast quarter of the Southeast corner of the Northwest quarter of Section 12, Township 32 N., Range 6 E., was divided as follows: Commencing at a point 50 chains East of the Southeast corner of the Donation Land Claim No. 29 of James Gilmore, running North 5.56 chains to the East line of said Lot 3; thence South to the Southeast corner of said Lot 3; thence South 29 chains to the Southwest corner of said Lot 3; thence North 7 chains to the place of beginning; thence North 5.56 chains to the place of beginning.

Also commencing at the Northwest corner of the Northwest quarter of Section 12, Township 32 N., Range 6 E., running South 2.25 chains to the Southwest corner of said Lot 3; thence North 7 chains to the place of beginning; thence North 5.56 chains to the place of beginning.

Also that part of Donation Land claim No. 41 of James P. Gilmore described as follows: Commencing at the Southeast corner of the Donation Land Claim No. 29 of James Gilmore; running South 12.25 chains; thence North 2 chains; thence North 12.25 chains; thence East 47 chains to the place of beginning.

Also that part of Section 11 described as follows: Commencing at the Southeast corner of said Lot 3; running West to a point 3.75 chains East of the Southwest corner of said Lot 3; thence North 7 chains; thence East to the Northeast corner of said Lot 3; thence South 7 chains to the place of beginning.

All of the above described premises being situated in Township 32 N., Range 6 E. west of the Williams Meridian, and containing in the aggregate 208 acres, more or less.

Together with the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances belonging or in any way appertaining.

That the same will be sold in one parcel as provided by said decree; and I will apply the proceeds of said sale, first, to the payment of the costs of said sale and to the costs and disbursements of said suit; and, second, to the payment of the amount due plaintiff on the aforesaid judgment with accrued interest.

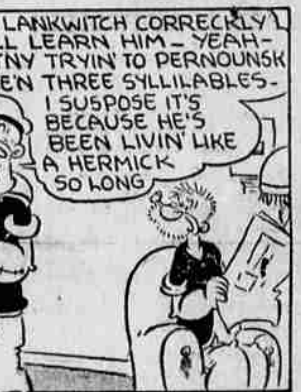
