EGGLESS DOUGHNUTS

MRS. L. E. GILLIAM, Roseburg.
1½ cups sugar
1 cup thick cream
2 cups buttermilk
1 teaspoon cinnamon
2½ teaspoons soda
¼ teaspoon salt
Flour to make a stiff dough to roll easily. Cut out, fry in hot fat.

CHOCOLATE SYRUP

MRS. LUCILLE CONN
Roseburg, Ore.
¼ cup Ghirardelli's ground chocolate
2 cups sugar
1 cup boiling water
Pinch salt
Mix chocolate, sugar and salt. Add boiling water slowly and boil five minutes. When cool add two tablespoons vanilla.
Put 2 tablespoons of the mixture in a glass and fill the glass nearly to the top with ice-cold milk. For a fancy drink top with one tablespoon whipped cream or ice cream. This syrup keeps well in refrigerator.
