CHEAPER ELECTRIC POWER ADVOCATED

HOOD RIVER, Dec. 10.—(AP)—What electric power from the Columbia river's great Bonneville dam can do for rural communities and farm homes will receive primary consideration from Mrs. William Munroe, representative from Hood River, at the January session of the state legislature.

"The prices that farmers of this district are forced to pay private utilities for power is too much. Bonneville must be used to solve this problem, not only in this community but elsewhere in Oregon," she said.

She recommended state-constructed power lines to "get away from the high rates with which the private companies are loading us down."

The newly elected democrat remarked that "those who have no power need it; those that have it need it cheaper."

Mrs. Munroe, a pear grower, is vitally interested in legislation which will eliminate damage to industry and agriculture through labor disputes.

GAMBLING DISPUTE REACHES COUNCIL

PORTLAND, Dec. 10.—(AP)—Portland's gambling dispute involving the city police, the sheriff and the district attorney offices reached the city council today.

Upon expression of Commissioner Bennett's concern over conditions, Mayor Joseph K. Carson said "something should be done about it." The commissioner remarked the gambling conditions were bringing criticism to the entire city government.

In reply to Chief of Police Harry Niles' request that the bureau be informed beforehand, when raids were planned by sheriff deputies, the district attorney's office said: "There is no reason why this office should be warning or notice to anyone other than the sheriff of raids to be made under search warrants."
