IDAHO BILL WOULD LICENSE GAMBLING

BOISE, Idaho, Jan. 20.—(AP)—A bill to license all forms of gambling in Idaho was prepared for presentation in the Idaho house of representatives.

House Speaker Troy D. Smith said the proposed act would produce \$2,000,000 annually and "eliminate the need for passage of a sales or transaction tax bill to produce additional revenue for relief."

The bill is similar to the Nevada law. It would make the operation of any gambling game by an unlicensed operator unlawful. License fees would range from \$10 to \$50; persons under the age of 21 years would be barred from games and rooms in which the gambling was done.

Present laws prohibit all gambling.
