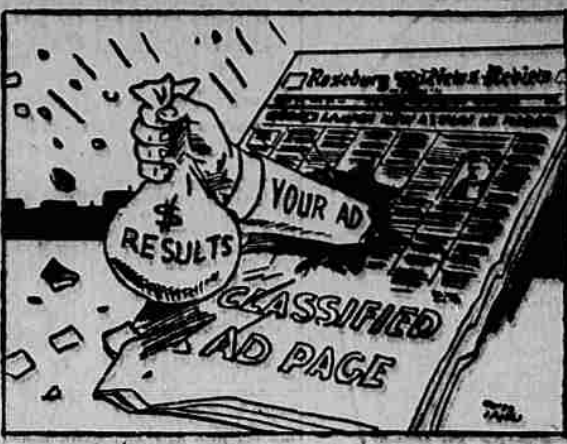

Summoned by the American Youth Congress to advance their rights, nearly 5,000 young persons of United States are expected to converge in Washington Feb. 19 to 22 to enlist support for the American youth act. This bill, scheduled to be introduced shortly in both chambers of congress, proposes expenditure of \$500,000,000 to aid young men and women in obtaining an education and jobs. As now drawn up, the bill would extend the work of the National Youth administration, headed by Aubrey Williams, as well as embody some of the activities of the OCC. President Roosevelt will speak to the youth delegation in Washington on Feb. 20.

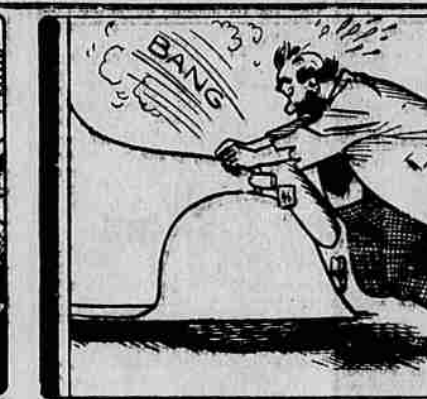

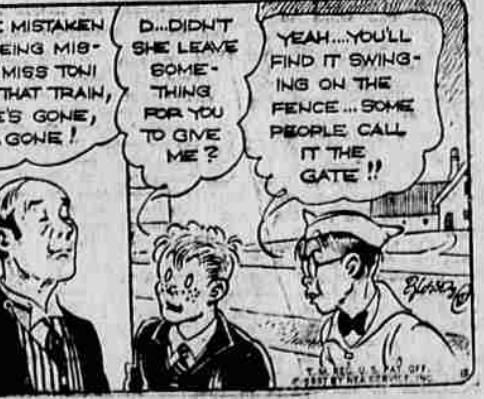
