

### ROSEBURG CORPS TO JOIN IN WAR GAME

EUGENE, May 20.—(AP)—The "Red army of Roseburg," due to arrive in the vicinity of Goshen Friday, will attack the city of Eugene Sunday morning—but the "Blue army of Eugene" is prepared and waiting to defend its city. The battle will start 9:30 a. m. Sunday. War was declared a month ago, and the "red" forces, advancing from the south, are pushing rapidly towards this university city.

This warlike statement was made here Thursday by officers of the army reserve stationed here, but it merely concerns activities of a contact "camp" which will be held here over the week-end by district reserve officers. Among the many things on the program for the week-end are pistol shooting competition and field exercises, which will be featured by a "battle" Sunday morning, during which various methods of communication from ground to air and air to ground will be tested.

The "red army's" attack will be featured by use of numerous aircraft, with 14 planes scheduled to arrive here from Boeing field, Seattle, Pearson field, Vancouver, Wash., and Felix field, Spokane. The first of these ships is expected Saturday morning.

Other important events on the two-day program include a banquet Saturday night, a smoker, and special church services Sunday. Well over 150 officers are expected for the "camp," with representatives scheduled to come from Salem, Portland, Corvallis, Medford, Bend, Gresham, Seaside, Pendleton, Klamath Falls, Marshfield and Roseburg. Several regular army officers and men from the U. S. air corps, and a large group of national guardsmen will take part in the maneuvers Sunday in addition to the reserve officers.

### AGNES DAVIS WINS ACCLAIM IN OPERA

NEW YORK, May 20.—(AP)—As the climax of one of the most arduous seasons ever given a young singer, Agnes Davis last night made her Metropolitan debut as Elsa in Wagner's "Lohengrin."

Miss Davis had never sung with the Metropolitan opera before, but since she won an Atwater Kent radio audition in 1927 she has been fairly often before the public. And since January of 1937, year she has made 80 concert appearances.

She was cordially received, and after some scenes more than that the large audience found her voice much better than average, and liked particularly her effort to give Elsa the dramatic life she seldom has.

Miss Davis is from Denver by way of the Curtis Institute in Philadelphia, where she had most of her voice work under Emilio de Gogorza and others.

### DISEASE AT FISH HATCHERY PUZZLES

BEND, May 20.—(AP)—Eastern brook trout fingerlings, stricken by an undetermined disease in the holding ponds of the Fall river state hatchery, are dying at the rate of a half-million a day, Don H. Peoples, secretary of the Deschutes County Sportsmen's association, said today.

Dr. J. C. Vandorvert, former member of the game commission, said hatchery officials have asked Oregon State college to send experts to investigate. The tiny fish started dying last week and it is estimated three million have perished.

The loss is confined to the hatchery ponds where there were originally six million trout. Peoples said authorities on parasites fungi examined the fish but could not find the cause of death.

### NO SUSPENSIONS, JUDGE DECLARES

MOSCOW, Idaho, May 20.—(AP)—Suspended sentences, Federal Judge C. O. Cavanah declared from the bench today, "make a joke of law."

Herbert McLean of Seattle who had just been convicted by a jury on a charge of transporting a stolen automobile across the state line. His attorney, Weldon Schimke, asked for a suspended sentence or a parole.

"There are no suspended sentences in this court," the judge declared. "They make a joke of law and encourage crime." McLean will be sentenced Saturday.

### GIANNINI BUYS BANK OF COOS BAY

PORTLAND, May 20.—(AP)—Control of the First National bank of Coos bay at Marshfield passed to the Giannini interests of Portland and San Francisco, Ben R. Chandler, president of the southwestern Oregon firm, announced today.

The bank's resources are estimated \$1,500,000. It will be operated as an independent bank though it may later become a branch of the First National bank of Portland, Chandler said.
