## OREGON TREASURY IN GOOD CONDITION

SALEM, July 13 — (AP)—The condition of the state treasury at the end of its fiscal year on June 30 was the best in 15 years, State Treasurer Rufus C. Holman reported today a cash balance of \$15,577,359 and total bonded debt of \$47,179,010.

The cash balance was almost a record high. The bonded debt was about \$16,000,000 below the 1928 bonded debt of \$63,235,710. There was \$8,276,662 in various state funds on June 30, including \$7,665,373 in the general fund. There was \$1,872,352 in the highway fund, but Holman pointed out that the highway commission must pay out \$1,000,000 in bonds and \$476,000 in bond interest on October 1.

Amounts in other funds included: Common school, \$434,863; industrial accident, \$307,280; vocational education, \$73,048; World War veterans state aid, \$142,967; public assistance, \$597,311.

The state's investments in bonds totaled \$10,706,419, including \$6,822,313 in the segregated account fund, \$2,022,280 in the veterans sinking fund, and \$1,861,826 in the industrial accident fund.

The total assessed valuation of all property in Oregon was about \$592,000,000.

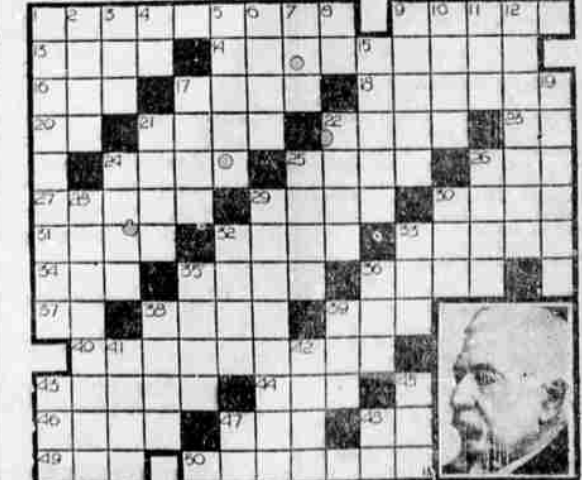

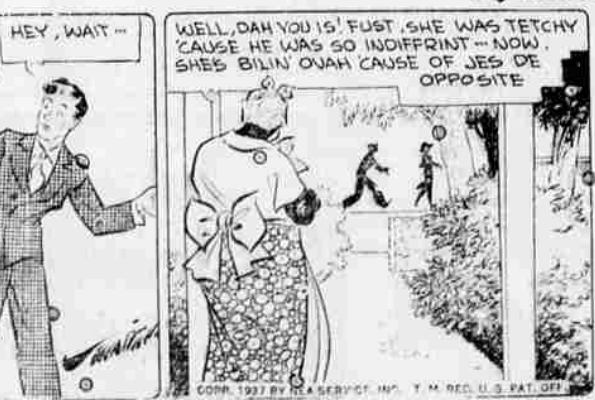
