NEW SCHOOL BUS RULES ANNOUNCED Rules and regulations promulgated by the public utilities commission to control school buses of the state have been completed, according to word received by County School Superintendent Stella Quine today.

Construction requirements were deferred at the request of many districts, including the high school districts of Douglas county, which contended that it was necessary to contract transportation before the rules could be made effective. Regulations becoming effective this year require lighting to comply with motor vehicle law, with the addition of a rear stop light and four-inch reflector on the rear of the vehicle and interior dome lights adequate to the size of the bus. Handrails must be located at the rear corner of the entrance step well. Ventilation must be controlled with sufficient capacity to maintain proper air conditions without the opening of windows. Adequate heating must be provided, but passing of exhaust gases through conductors within the body of the car is prohibited.

WEATHERLY GRANGE LEADS PEST HUNT Douglas county grange members have destroyed 7,562 farm pests for a total of 474,816 points in the county-wide pest hunt sponsored by Douglas County Pomona grange, according to Fred A. Goff, chairman of the agricultural committee. Fred Weatherly grange leads the list, with Evergreen second and Riverside third.
