A fatigued driver is a memace, not only to himself, but to everyone near him on a highway, the motor association traffic safety examiners point out.

No statistics are available, but it is declared frue that thousands of accidents have been caused by drivers being either tired or actually asleep at the wheel.

Fatigue is not only caused by driving too long without rest, but that dangerous "fired feeling" or actual sleep may suddenly engulf the driver for a number of other reasons, safety experts explain.
